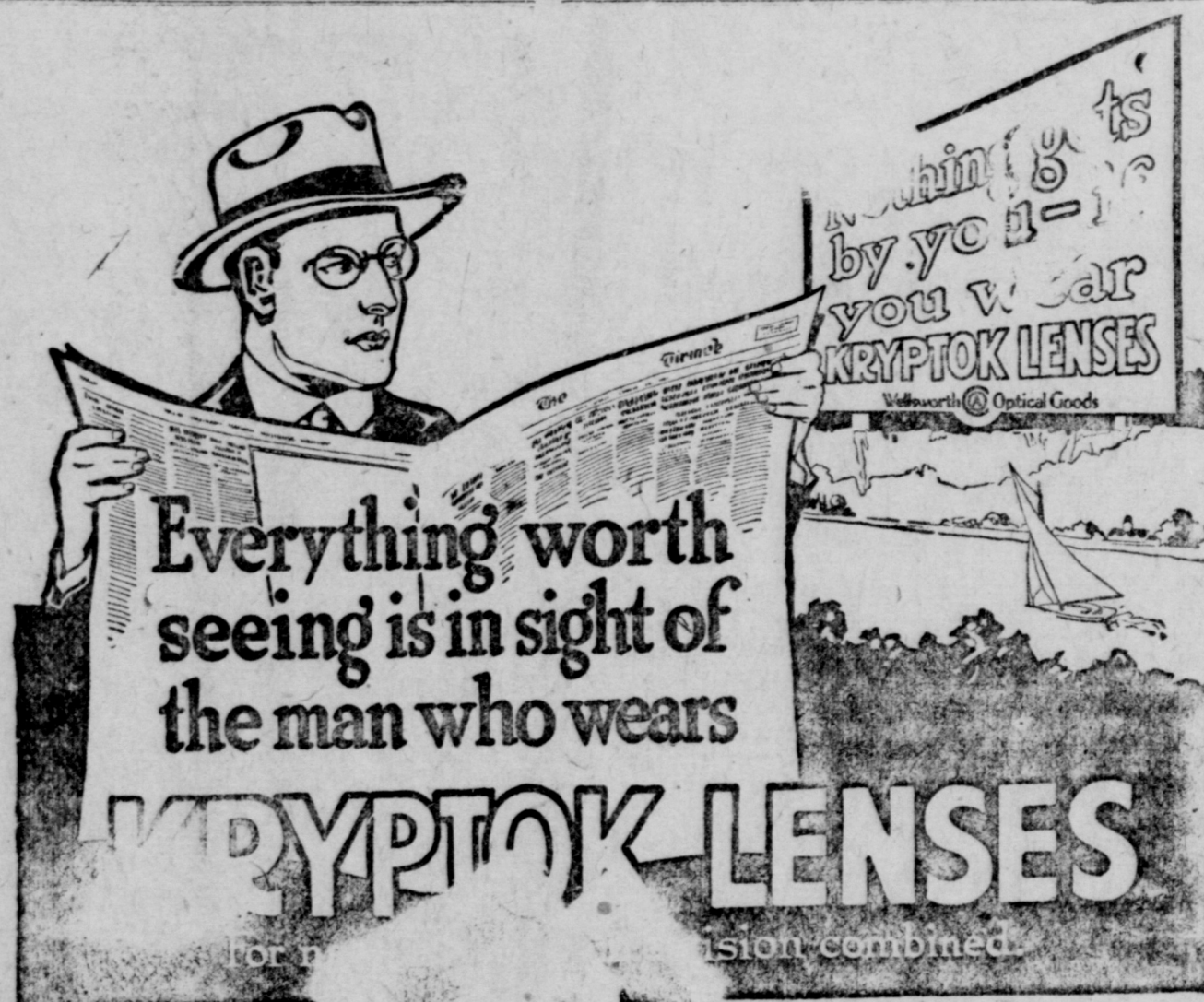

## Hon. F. B. Carvell "olds Successful Meetings"

(Continued from page two.)  
Sir Wilfrid. "Up to the time I reached that decision," said he "no leader ever had a more devoted follower, no follower ever regarded a leader with more pride and admiration than I did Sir Wilfrid Laurier. I have no quarrel with him today. I have not a hard word to say against him. And when I say that I speak not only for myself but for the 26 other Liberals who broke away from him when I did. We simply could not approve of his policies and he did not measure up to our war standards, and, consequently, we had to go our own way."

## SUPPORTED WAR MEASURE.

"I voted for the conscription bill as I have also voted for every measure introduced into the house of commons and looking to the support of the soldiers. That was only my duty as at the first session of the Canadian parliament after the outbreak of war every man stood pledged to the support of the soldiers, every man voted in the affirmative on the question whether Canada should enter this war, every man agreed that we should pay our own expenses, every man joined in the pledge that we should stand behind the soldiers to the last man and the last dollar and the men who donned the khaki went overseas with that pledge in their ears and minds. That, to me was a solemn contract which I intend shall be kept."

After the conscription act became law and the house prorogued the Liberals who had voted for that measure met with Sir Wilfrid Laurier and tried to get an understanding as to the platform on which they would go to the country. The most we could get was the promise of a referendum. Then I put it up to Sir Wilfrid as to what would happen to the men already in uniform under the conscription measure and he said that they would be held in abeyance until the referendum had been taken. That was enough for me. I broke with him on that rock and the Union government was formed within 24 hours.

## UNION GOVERNMENT.

Speaking more particularly of the Union government, Mr. Carvell said it was formed to promote all war measures and to honestly administer the business of the country. The agreement under which it came into being was for the period of the war and a reasonable time thereafter for the demobilization of the troops and when those things had been accomplished the contract closed. In conclusion he referred in feeling terms to the great wastage of men among the Canadian troops and the necessity of keeping our divisions intact. As an instance of this wastage he pointed out that in ten days in November 10,000 Canadians had been put out of action, a number that could not be equalized by voluntary enlistment in three months. This in itself showed that some method of compulsion must be enforced if the men are not to be deserted by the people at home.

## VOTE ON PRINCIPLE.

This is not a campaign in which the personnel of the candidates counts for nothing. The people are asked to vote on a principle, the biggest, most vivid principle upon which they have ever been asked to express an opinion. In this country you are not voting for F. B. Carvell or J. E. Porter, but upon the question of standing by the boys at the front or falling down on that duty. I am standing by the government that is standing by the boys at the front, and if you stand by me you will as well be standing by the boys at the front. You will have done your duty and you will not be ashamed to look the boys in the face and say so.

After dealing briefly with the financial aspect of the case in so far as Canada was concerned, Mr. Carvell closed with a forceful peroration in which he again impressed upon the people their plain duty.

The meeting closed with the National Anthem. It was a most successful meeting in every sense of the word and, taken in conjunction with those held earlier in the week, affords certain evidence that the people of Carleton-Victoria are solidly behind Mr. Carvell and the government of which he is a member.

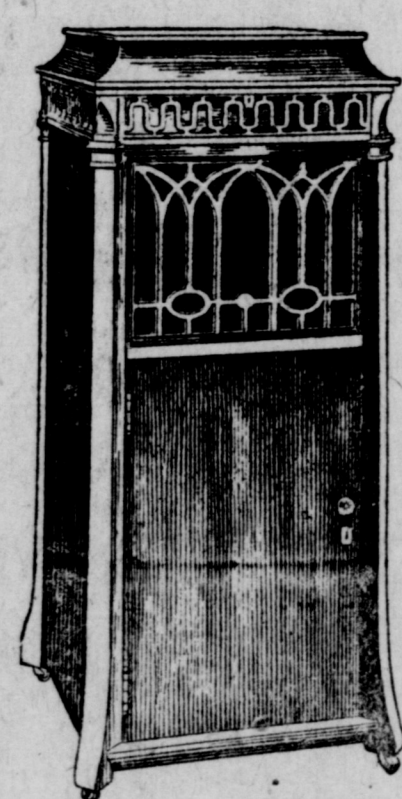
The funeral which was very largely
