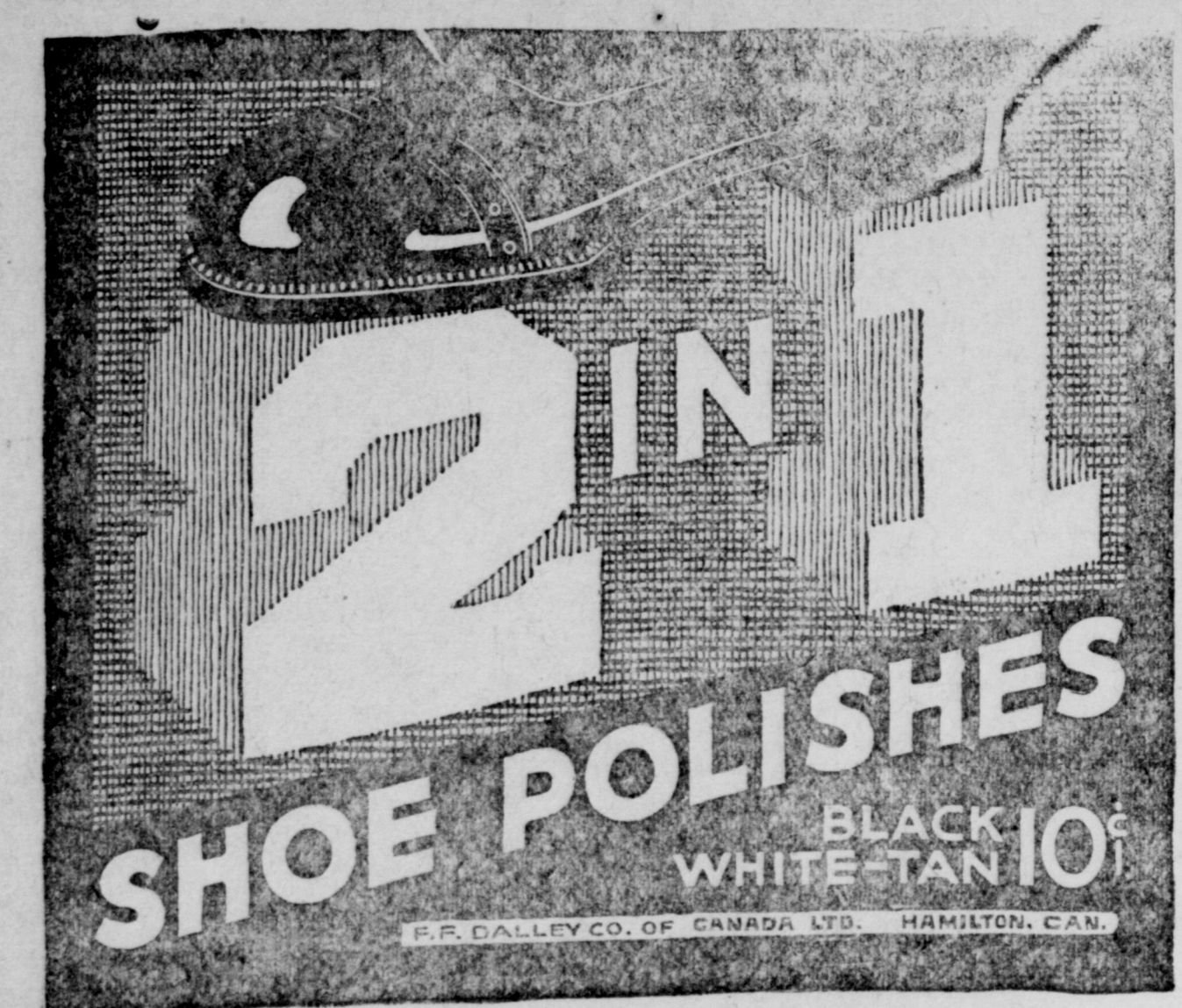

TWENTY YEARS AGO

From the Sentinel
October 1897.

In Bye and Bye Mr. Belyea secured one of the very best trotting representatives in this country, and we congratulate Mr. Hughes upon having bred so good a one. When it is taken into consideration that Bye and Bye was put right on the track out of the binder last year, it is easily seen that she is a wonderful mare.

The shoe and larrigan factory and shingle mill of W. H. Lawrence & Co., at Burr's Corner, eighteen mile above Fredericton, on the Woodstock branch of the C.P.R., was burned Friday night, and with the contents, was a total loss. The factory employed some fifteen hands, who had been at work all day. Between 9 and 10 o'clock in the evening the fire was discovered in the shingle mill, which soon had control of the whole building. The origin of the fire has been caused from a workman's pipe. The loss is estimated at \$3,000. The insurance is \$5,500.

PROHIBITION ACT SOON IN FORCE IN CARLETON COUNTY

The New Brunswick Prohibition Act becomes operative in Carleton at 1 o'clock a. m., Dec. 4th.

It will be well to remember the following facts in connection with the Act:

All consignments of liquors in freight or express offices are open to inspections by Inspectors who may seize all or any such and hold such until consignee proves right to such.

No such liquors may be delivered to any place other than a "private dwelling" house under the definition of this Act. Consignee cannot carry his liquors from freight or express office himself or his servant—must be delivered by said common carrier and receipted for in person and on such premises.

Any place other than a "private dwelling" is subject to search at any time without a warrant; a private dwelling may be searched on a warrant and on one conviction of tenant ceases to be a private dwelling and is subject to search without a warrant at any time. A conviction of a tenant is de facto a conviction of the owner of such premises. No one may have or sell, give or barter etc. liquor except under a license provided by the law, in any place other than in a private dwelling and there only for his personal use. The finding of such prohibited liquor is prima facie evidence that it was kept for sale and subjects person to penalties. In all cases the onus of proof of legal possession is on the accused.

Any person intoxicated is subject to arrest, to be taken before any magistrate and an affidavit be required from him stating where and from whom liquor was obtained, failure to do so shall subject him to imprisonment.

All officers appointed under this act may exercise their full powers in any part of the county or province under this Act.

There can be no remission of penalties by magistrate or justices.

Every police officer is responsible for the enforcement of this Act, and failure to act on any information, or

under this Act.
