THE DAWN OF A NEW DAY.

The Murray-Baxter-Smith government has at last reached the "end of its tether." The resignation of the most shameful and corrupt government that has ever disgraced a British country was handed to Lieut. Governor Wood Thursday. This political machine added to its daring and unblushing corruption by clinging to power for five weeks after its defeat. It is well known that some members of the combination were hanging on by reason of fear of more disgraceful and damaging exposures that will be made when the proper time arrives. For eight years the Fleming-Smith-Baxter combination has blighted the public life of New Brunswick and exercised a most evil influence. The disgraceful stories of the Fleming-Teed-Berry steal and the potato transaction of B. F. Smith have made New Brunswick politics, under Tory rule, a by-word and a shame. The government was caught with the goods and there was no escape.

It is to be hoped that the elimination of this ring will end the debasing influences that have poisoned public life and stifled the growth of free, independent and wholesome public opinion. It means new life, new hope, new men and new methods in the administration of public affairs. It is a great triumph for the Liberal party who have fought courageously and patriotically against overwhelming odds, and against the most unscrupulous political methods which ever dishonored

THINK IT OVER!

This is the gravamen of the charge against Hon. Robert Rogers as summarized by the Winnipeg Free Press: Mr. Rogers, a trustee for the people of Manitoba, arranged that \$8,700 should be taken from the Provincial Treasury, over which he had control; of this money \$7,500 was spent forthwith in a political campaign in securing the election of a candidate who was actively supported by Mr. Rogers. Upon these facts becoming known Mr. Rogers, under oath, told a detailed story which was shown to be untrue by his own cross-examination and by other evidence most conclusive in character. This story, carefully concocted and delivered under oath with brazen assurance, was a deliberate attempt to put the guilt of the transaction upon an official who was in his grave.

And this is the man whom Sir Robert chose to accompany him to London and sit by his side in the Councils of the Empire, as a representative of Canada! What do the decent people of Canada think of the affront to their country's honor? Think it over.
