The Red Cross Society of Woodstock has forwarded 30 boxes of clothing and bedding and a great deal of it was new.

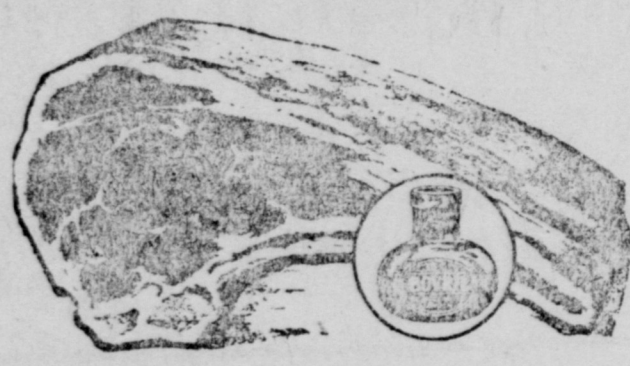
The usual week of prayer services will be held in several of the Woodstock churches beginning January 7, 1918. Announcements of a detailed nature will be given later.
