IN FAVOR OF UNION.

W. A. Charlton, who has represented Norfolk county in the House of Commons as a Liberal for some years, has definitely announced his allegiance to the Union government of Sir Robert Borden. In a letter published in the Simcoe Reformer, addressed to H. B. Donly, president of the Norfolk County Liberal Association, Mr. Charlton says.

"More than two years ago I became impressed with the necessity for a union government. The gravity of the situation indicated clearly that party strife had no longer any rightful place in the affairs of this country, and during that time I have done all in my power toward the formation of such a government. I feel it my duty to inform you, in your official capacity as President of the Norfolk County Liberal Association, that I am a supporter of the newly-formed union government. Their manifesto, issued a few days ago, should be satisfactory to all classes of people. "This is no time for division. This is the darkest day in the history of the world. Our united efforts are essential for the preservation of civilization."

WASTE OF FOOD.

Food is wasted when we eat more food than our bodies need for growth and repair and to supply energy for our work. Over-eating tends to poor health and fat instead of brawn, makes us sluggish and indolent instead of energetic and resourceful. Eat enough and no more. Eat for physical and mental efficiency.

If food is burned or spoiled in cooking, improperly prepared or poorly seasoned it will be left on the table and probably wasted. Buy food wisely and then prepare it carefully.

There is much loss when too much food is prepared for a meal. Unserved portions are apt to be thrown into the garbage pail or allowed to spoil.

Many housekeepers do not know how to use left-over foods to make appetizing dishes.

When too much food is served at a meal uneaten portions are left on the plate and later thrown into the garbage pail. Learn to know the needs of your family, and serve each no more than you think they will want.

Anything edible should not be allowed to go to the garbage pail or allowed to spoil for lack of proper handling.

Food is wasted by careless handling. Buy clean food, keep it clean until used, and be neat in all details of cooking and serv-



ing. This lessens waste and is a valuable health measure as well. Feed your family first and don't feed high-priced food to hogs or chickens.

Housekeepers should never pour into the sewer nonishish food in the shape of milk, skim milk, sweet or sour, soup gravy, or melted fat, or water in which cereals or vegetables have been cooked.

Thrift can be demonstrated in every home, and "saving" the watchword rather than "spending."

Don't forget that oatmeal is a hearty and palatable food.

Delays are dangerous. Better register now. The law of the land must be obeyed.

The survivors of the first Canadian contingent are to be brought home. They certainly deserve a long furlough.




