Realizing the acute situation regarding the fuel and steel supply for manufacturing war munitions, an influential delegation representing the Automobile manufacturers of the United States, voluntarily offered to reduce their automobile production 50 per cent, devoting 50 per cent of their production to war munitions.

This offer has evidently been refused as the United States War Trade Board has ruled they must be on 100 per cent War Productions by January 1st, next.
