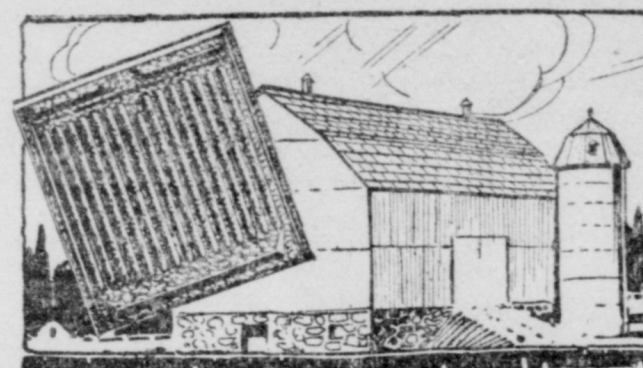
### CLARA FERNE BRIGGS.
