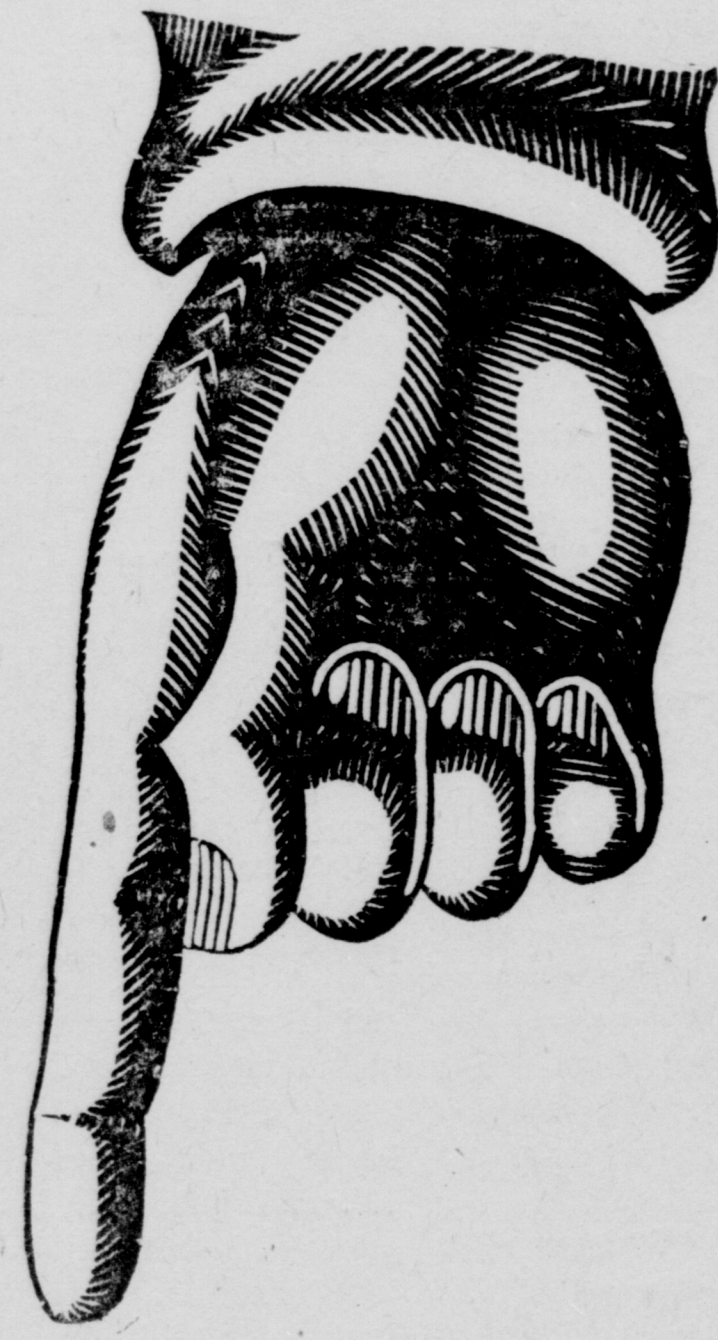

## SPECIAL ORDERS FOR ROAD WORK AFTER RAINS

REPUTATION FOR BETTER  
ROADS TO BE MAINTAINED

Minister of Public Works Has  
Taken Prompt Action--Sods  
Must Not be Put on  
the Roads

Hon. P. J. Veniot, Minister of Public Works, for New Brunswick, has taken prompt action in the matter of improving the highways of the province after the recent heavy rains. All supervisors have been instructed or will be instructed to work on the highways with the split-log drag and the road plow as soon as the road surface is dry enough. This work will repair the damage done to the surface by the rains and will help in the shedding of future rainfalls.

## AFTER EACH RAIN.

Particular stress is laid upon the fact that the drag should be used after every rain upon all roads subject to heavy motor-traffic. It is the intention of the Public Works Department to retain the reputation for better roads which was gained last autumn. Main Parish roads are not to be neglected but are to have the drag used upon them.

## SODS TO BE REMOVED

The practice of putting sods upon the roads is to be stopped. This is an old practice and it is reported that it has been followed in certain sections this year. Supervisors are particularly warned not to permit this.
