## Water By-Law

Continued from page seven  
PENALTIES.

32. Any person who shall,
- (1) Use water without a proper permit from the Collector of Water Rates; or
  - (2) Allow or permit any tap to remain open or water to run continuously from any fixture; or
  - (3) Being the owner or plumber or other person by such owner employed connect up any water fixtures to any water service in any building or premises, or connect any additional fixtures or tap to any water service, without a proper permit therefor, being first produced to him by the owner or his representative; or
  - (4) Use water through a hose without first having attained a sprinkling permit therefor, from the Collector of Water Rates, or authorized representative; or

(5) Open or in any way interfere with any hydrant, water main or service belonging to the water works without first having obtained a permit therefor from the Superintendent of Water Works, or in case of fire from the Chief of the Fire Department or his

(6) Damage, mutilate, destroy or injure any machine, material, hydrant, pipe, meter, or other property or article belonging to the water works; or

(7) Remove or interfere with any meter whether his own or the property of the town affixed to any water service;

Will be guilty of a breach of this by-law and liable to a penalty of not exceeding \$100 for each infraction thereof.

## (33) AMENDMENTS.

This by-law may be repealed, altered or amended, at any time, by the Town Council of said Town, as may be deemed advisable.

## (34) REPEAL OF OLD BY-LAWS.

All the by-laws, orders, rules and regulations in the by-law to regulate the use of water to be supplied by the water works in the Town of Woodstock and to establish the rates to be charged therefor heretofore enforced are hereby repealed except that said by-law shall be and remain in full so far as relates to water rates now due or hereafter to accrue due up to and including the first day of November, A. D. 1918, until the whole of same whether now due or hereafter to become due up to and including said first day of November A. D. 1918, and under same all proceedings for the collections of said Water rates and charges shall be taken and concluded.
