

The shortage of man labor has resulted in a large increase in the number of women barbers in the larger cities.

In London there are women who earn a livelihood by pawning jewelry and clothes for other women who are ashamed to be seen entering a pawnshop.

It is estimated that more than 5,000 young women are now employed as elevator conductors in stores, office buildings, hotels and apartment houses in New York City.

Queen Wilhelmina of Holland cares less for travel than any other European sovereign. Ardently devoted to her home and family, she has seldom quit the confines of her little country except to pay the formal visits demanded by royal etiquette or reasons of state.

The young queen of Spain, who remains thoroughly English despite her long residence in the land of the Dons, is reported to be exerting every influence to induce King Alfonso to break with Germany over the submarine issue and throw the weight

of Spanish support on the side of the Entente Allies.

Soon after he came to the throne, the Kaiser appointed his grandmother, Queen Victoria, colonel of the First Prussian Dragon Guards. The British queen was one of the first women to command troops, and in her younger years took great pleasure in attending reviews and riding at the head of the troops, in uniform.
