The seat of war has been transferred to Fredericton.

Some incidents in connection with the selection of men for overseas duty are developing a local sentiment that is not complimentary to certain officers and is to be deplored at this critical time. We want no standard of Prussianism in this country.

A tempest of considerable dimensions has been stirred up over the present mail service. If the local trains leave McAdam before the arrival of mail trains the criticisms seem warranted. Of course allowances must be made for the troubles caused by storms and a winter of unusual severity.

Mr. John Hall is making a "sanitary survey" of the Province. So far as his report goes it seems to belittle towns and institutions to which he paid a few minutes visit. A report of this nature is a poor aid to promote the development of a community. So far as Woodstock is concerned it is alive now and always has been to its full responsibilities and there is a pronounced feeling that some references in this report are erroneous and entirely uncalled for.

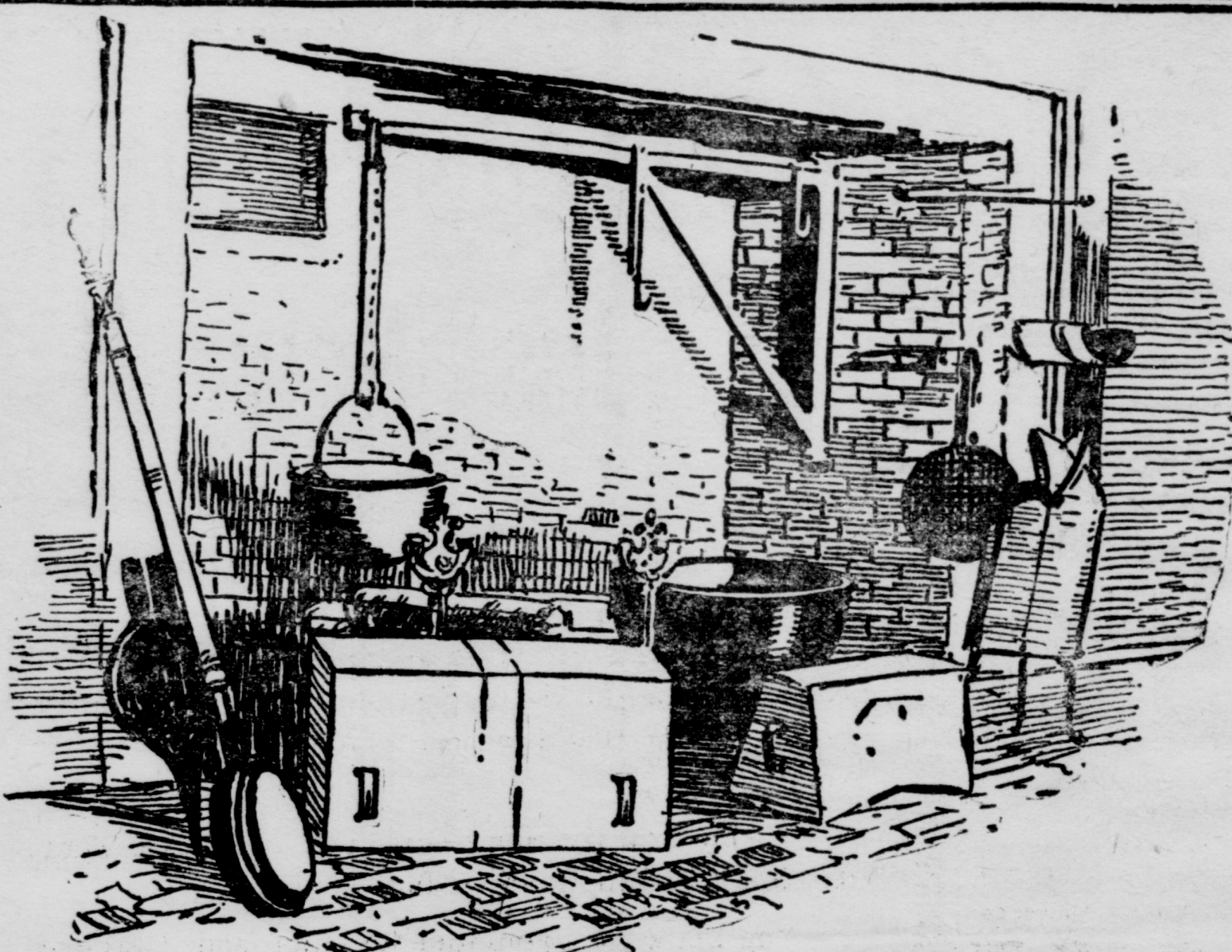

DISTRIBUTION OF SEED GRAIN - 1918

Good Seed is Scarce. Place your order Now, with your County Councillor.

The Department of Agriculture has ordered 56,000 bushels of oats and 18,000 bushels of wheat.

Oats will be sold for \$1.32 per bushel, in bulk, car lots, or \$1.38 in bags in car lots laid down.

Wheat will be sold for \$3.00 per bushel, in bags, car lots or f. o. b. distributing point for smaller orders.

Local freights will be paid by purchaser.

County Councillors and Agricultural Societies should place car lot orders immediately, stating destination for cars.

Delivery not guaranteed unless orders placed within three weeks, because of transportation difficulties.

New Brunswick is expected to bread herself for the duration of the war. EVERY Farmer should grow some wheat.
