According to authoritative information from the United States War Department American troops are being sent to France faster than at any previous time since the war began. Concerning numbers, the only permissible statement is that Secretary of War Baker's promise of half a million men in Europe this year is being fulfilled and that there will be ample means of getting 1,500,000 troops in France before next January. After that the number will depend on how many more men are needed, measured in millions or in thousands to carry out the mandate of the American people to win the war, says a Washington dispatch.

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
