

#### CHANGES ON MAIL SERVICE HITS **WOODSTOCK HARD**

Fredericton?

The following change in train serhas been announced. The harges will seriously affect the mail rvice at Woodstock.

On and after Jan. 21, train 101, now leaving St. John at 5.45 a.m., arriving at McAdam at 8.40 a.m., and Vanceboro at 9.25 a.m., making connections at Fredericton Junction for Fredericon, and at McAdam for all points north and south, will be

On and after Jan. 21 train 102 now leaving Vanceboro at 7 p.m., McAdam at 7.40 p.m., arriving at St John at 10.30 p.m. (11.30 Atlantic time) making connections at McAdam from all points north and south and at Fredericton Junction 'from Fredericton, will be cancelled.

It is said that the Woodstock mail will probably be sent by way of the C.P.R. to Fredericton transferring there to the valley road which will get it into Woodstock that evening.
