

Hon. Mr. Currie testiled that when Murchie introduced the question stumpage he informed the scaler that Mr. Richards had told him that he (Richards) had settled the stumpage with the scaler and the witness refused to discuss the matter- He merely told Murchie to do the best he could without doing wrong, according to his evidence. He also testified that he had advised Murchie not to do anything that would get him into trouble. As to his knowledge of the cut at that time, he explained that once the company was assured of the logs they needed-in that year about four million feetthey were not much concerned with the remainder and did not attempt to check up their cut definitely until they received the reports of the results of the saw mill operation. He had not attempted to check the stumpage payment as Mr. Richards the company, he managed the manu-
