

(Continued from page one) this knowledge might qest be imparted to our yhung agriculturists some systematic agricultural education must be established; hence 'the Vocational School, Woodstock.

This new system af education must of course offer general academic branches, as these are the prerequisites of farming and home making intelligence. In propriety therefore with this new idea, academic subjects, including English, Civics and Citizenship, and Arithmetic, are taught in conjunction with the Home Making and Agricultural Courses. The school day in each of these courses consises of six hours. Three hours each day will be devoted to the study of the subjects as outlined in the courses, while the remaining three hours are given to lectures in academic subjects. Education for farmer's son and daughter must not lead them away from the farm, but teach them to bring the best from the outside world into farm life. To accomplish this is the aim of the Vocational School.

To meet a local demand, pareicularly one existing in the town, a course in Typewriting and Stenography was arranged and this is now in same time as the Home Making Course and is for the same duration. This class is filled to capacity, and those completing the caurse will be equipped with the necessary knowledge to fill positiont as competent stenographers in offices.

Evening Classes, which started on November 10th, are held every Monday and Friday evening in Typewriting and Stenography, in Sewing. and in Millinery. As time advances and needs arise further evening classes will be arranged.

Besides the regular day and evening classes, the different grades from the Public and High Schools are given instruction in Home Making and Bench Woodwork. Below is given the complete list of names of the 257 students at present receiving instruction at the Vocational School Woodstock:


