worth following.

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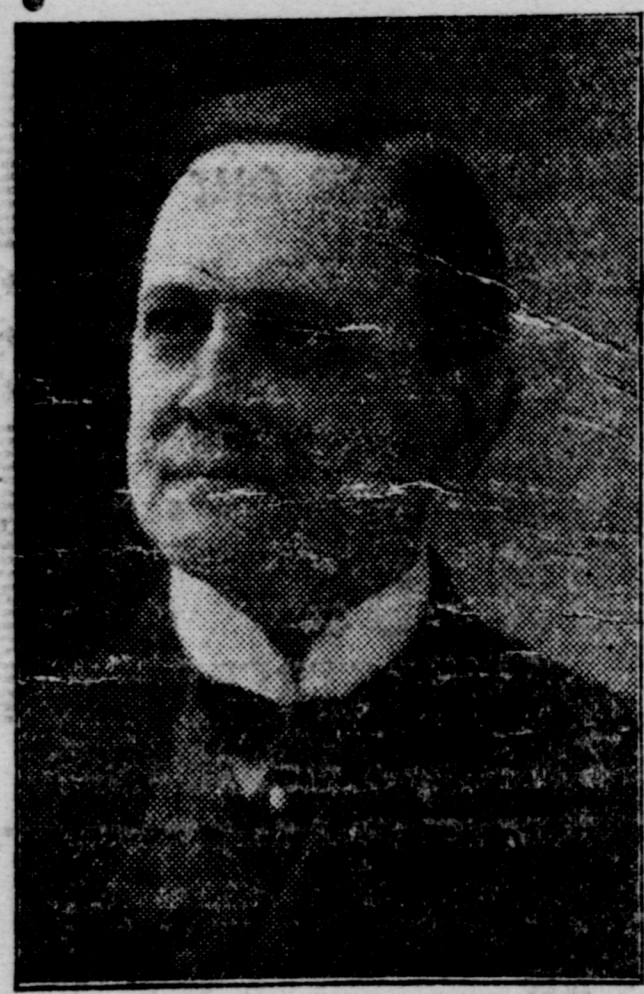

Rev. Austen K. DeBlois Attracts
Many Maritime Province Vis-

preachers of Boston has been nation-

men as Phillips Brooks of Trinity,
George C. Lorimer of Tremont Tem-
ple, and many others are delightful
memories for the present generation.

fame of Boston's preachers has shed
a lustre to that city, the Athens of
America.

preacher, with excellent music, can
be heard. One of the most popular
and best known preachers of Boston,
today, is Rev. Austen K. DeBlois,
pastor of the Commonwealth Ave.,
and Clarendon St. Baptist Church,

(off Copley Square) who was born
in his eight years of ministry here
at Wolfville, Nova Scotia, and dur-
has endeared himself to the people,
particularly Canadian born, of this
city. Consequently, on Sunday mor-
nings one is sure to meet other Cana-
dians at this church when visiting
Boston. In fact, the Maritime Prov-
inces have always furnished their
quota of ministers for Boston and
nearby cities' churches, the most of
whom have been graduates of Acadia
College.

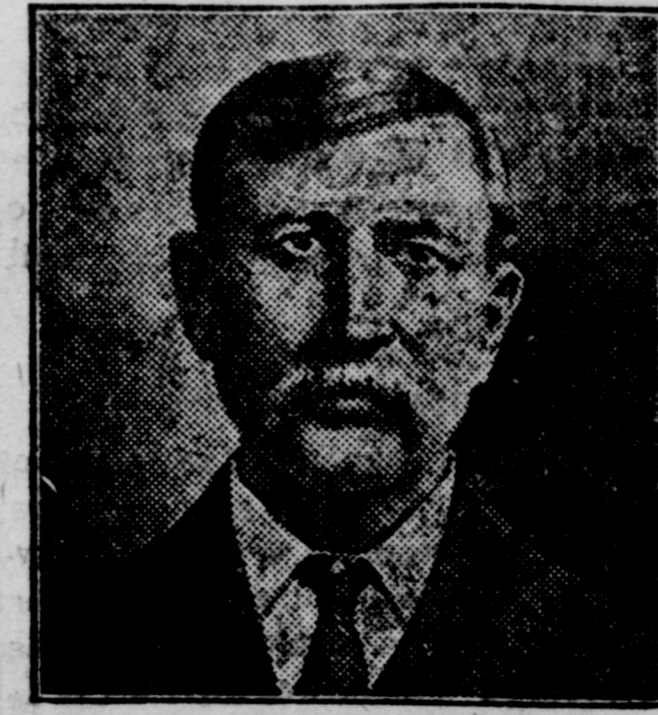
Dr. DeBlois was born at Wolfville,
N. S., the son of Dr. Stephen W. De
Blois, for 30 years pastor of the
Wolfville Baptist Church. The son
graduated from Acadia College in the
class of 1886 and then went to
Brown University for a post graduate
course, taking his Master's degree in
1888 and Ph. D. in 1889, being spoken
of at that time as "the youngest
Doctor of Philosophy in the world,"
and later, "the youngest College Pre-
sident."

Five years later he assumed the
pastorate of the First Church of El-
gin, just out of Chicago, a church of
1,300 members. Later was pastor at
the Great First Church of Chicago,
succeeding Dr. P. S. Henson, who
had succeeded Dr. George C. Lorimer
both far famed pulpit orators.

About eight years ago, Dr. De Blois
was called to the First Baptist
Church, Boston, where he has since
been preaching to large congrega-
tions. The first Baptist Church is
one of the landmark edifices in Bos-
ton, designed by Richardson, the fa-
mous architect, and one of the old-
est religious organizations on the
Western continent, founded in 1665,
and has enjoyed 254 years of contin-
uous life and illustrious history. The
friezes on the tower were modeled by
the French sculptor Bartholdi, and

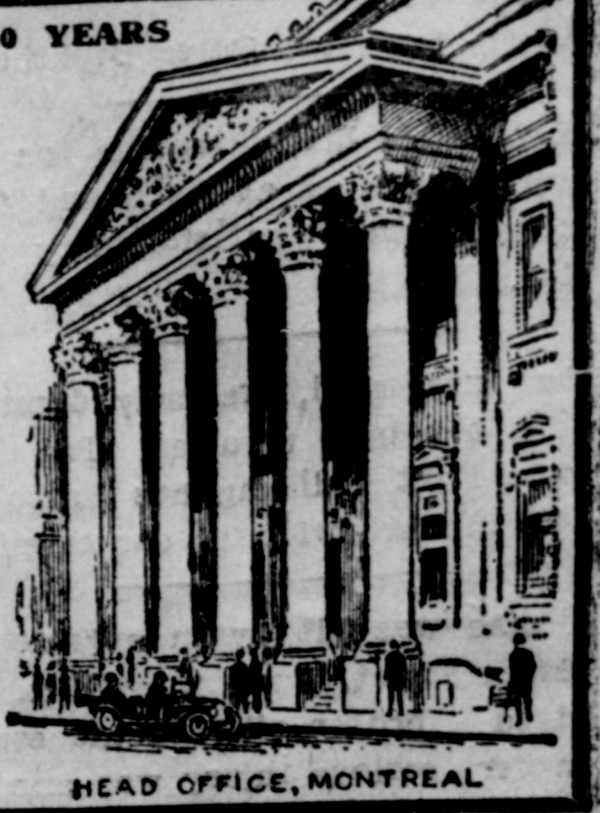
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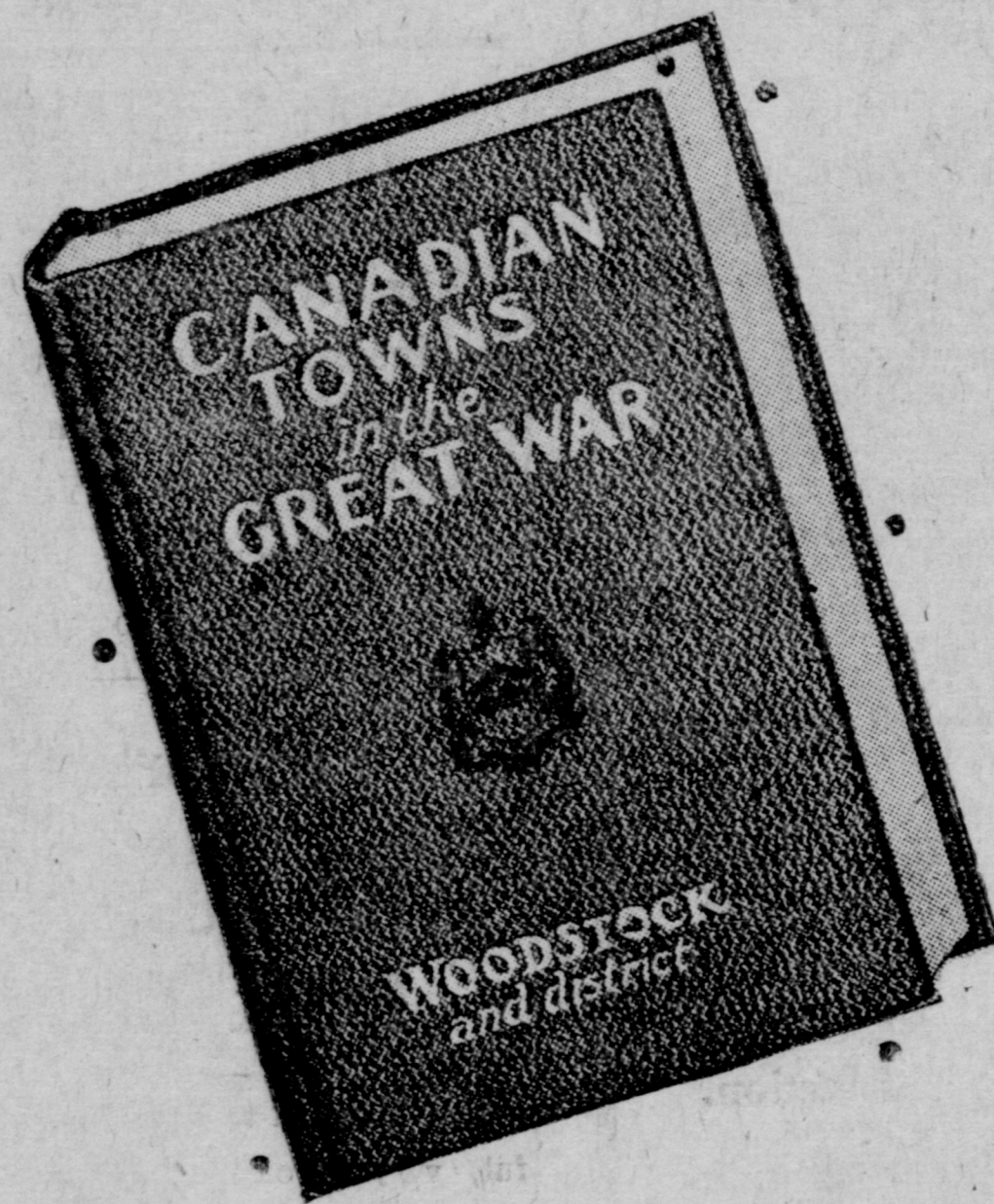
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
