The barns contained hay, grain, machinery and live stock, and in many cases persons were killed therein, who had taken refuge from the storm. The houses contained the usual necessary equipment for housekeeping, many valuable heirlooms that could not be replaced, and human lives, the value of which cannot be estimated. Will insurance repay the loss? Never! With the insurance money you may be able to rebuild but that does not replenish the barns with feed, machinery and live stock that are seldom insured, nor bring back the loved ones stricken down in the homes. Insurance is a good thing, but absolute prevention of loss is better. Carry insurance; it is not always lightning that does the damage. But by all means have the best lightning rods to protect your lives and property. A good lightning rod properly installed is absolute protection from lightning.

Sir: The Board of School Trustees of the Town of Woodstock herewith submit their report for the past School Year. The School buildings and equipment generally are in first class condition. Under the efficient management of Miss Julia Neales, the Principal, we have graduated a class of eighteen in the Grammar School, and have examined a class of sixty for entrance, of which eighteen failed. Under rather unsatisfactory conditions we consider we have had a most successful year.

Commencing with this Autumn the Vocational School will be separated from the management of the Board, and will be conducted by a special Vocational School Committee, Woodstock having the honor of being the first town to inaugurate adequate Vocational Training.
