## IMPOSING BUILDINGS WILL ADD TO SPLENDOR OF BEAUTIFUL CONNELL PARK

**Contracts Let for Expenditure of \$30,000 This Season--Provincial Government Grants \$10,000--Widespread Interest Shown in Big Event Staged for September--Prominent Citizens Take Keen Interest and Are Active Members of Committees--Race Course An Added Feature--Thirty-Three Entries Already--\$4000 in Prizes.**

What the future holds for Agricultural Society No. 41, cannot be foretold today, but many things, far reaching in their importance, combine to justify the painting of the coming year in colors most rosy. The success attending the active promoters of the St. John Valley Exhibition, thus far, would cause any community throughout the broad universe to be filled with a feeling of optimism. The enterprise, thrift, pluck and dauntless energy of the committees who are launching the big exhibition have already demonstrated the great possibilities of united effort. In past years, the agricultural exhibitions held in Woodstock were always the acme of satisfaction to the immense crowds who attended. For reasons that perhaps apply to many other places, the interest abated and finally "fair day" ceased to be on the list of attractions for fall visitors. This condition, however, could not continue owing to the marvellous opportunities offered by Carleton County. Progressive farmers, up-to-date merchants and enthusiastic citizens all voiced the same opinion--"We must have fall exhibitions." It is not necessary to go into further details concerning the launching of the enterprise. Suffice to say that Mr. A. B. Connell, who is the prominent trustee of Connell Park, had an important part in making the affair a reality when he leased a portion of the Park to the Agricultural Society for exhibition purposes. This spot is blessed by nature with her richest gifts and praised and appreciated by those who have seen its beauty.

And, as an auspicious start, this beautiful island, in the center of the majestic St. John, is dedicated to the convenience and pleasure of the people for all time.

In every enterprise the financial end is always the important feature, and it will be well to state that the society proposes to expend this season \$28,000, principally in buildings, to be completed Sept. 1st. Mr. Henry Post will have general supervision of the work, and Mr. Percy Corbett will be the engineer. The government has granted \$10,000, of which \$3,500 is available at once; subscriptions amount to \$7,000; proceeds of land sale \$2,500; lumber on hand, \$1500.

The dates of the exhibition will be Sept. 9, 10, 11, 12. The prize lists are in course of preparation. \$15,000 will be awarded in prizes.

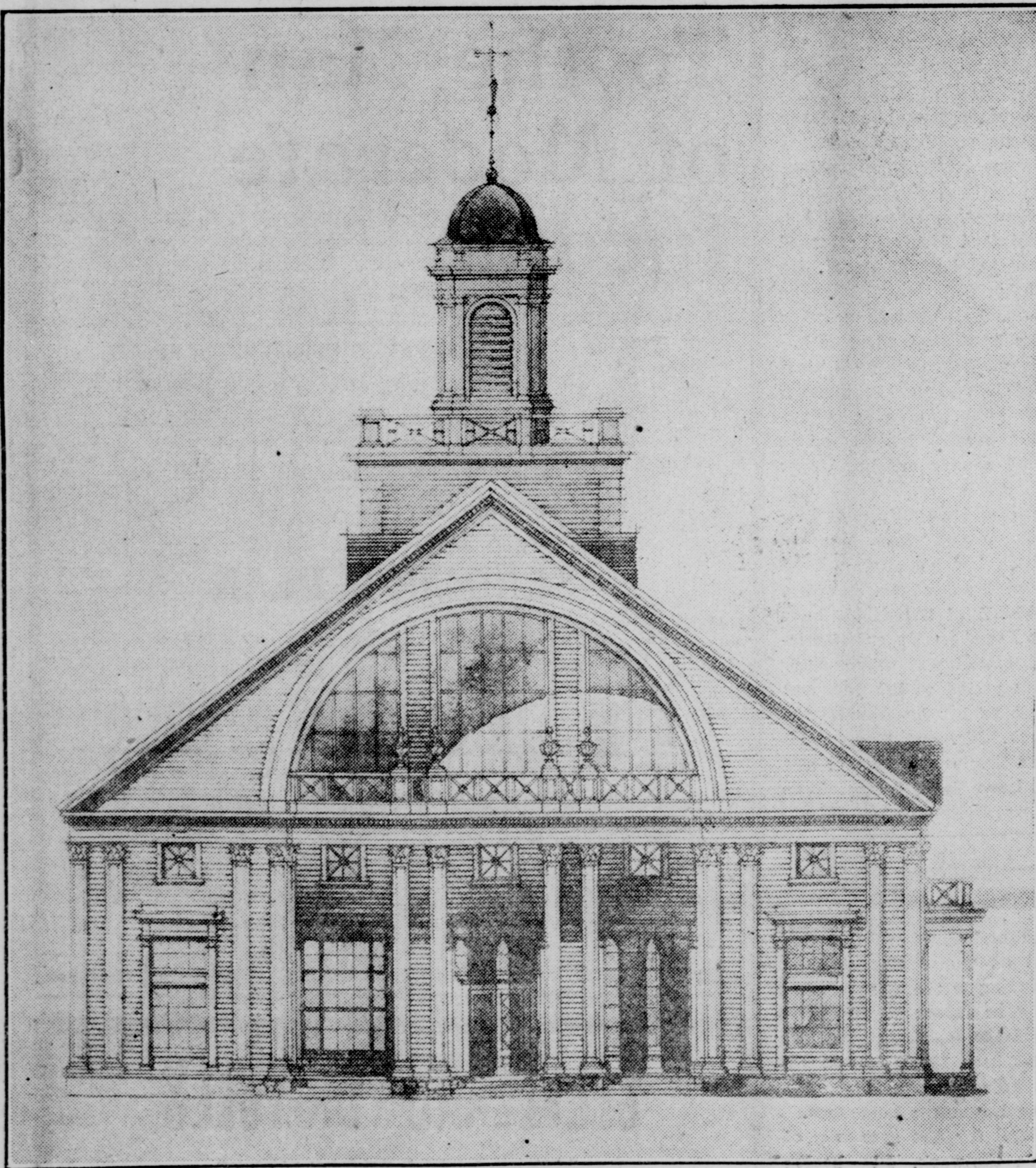

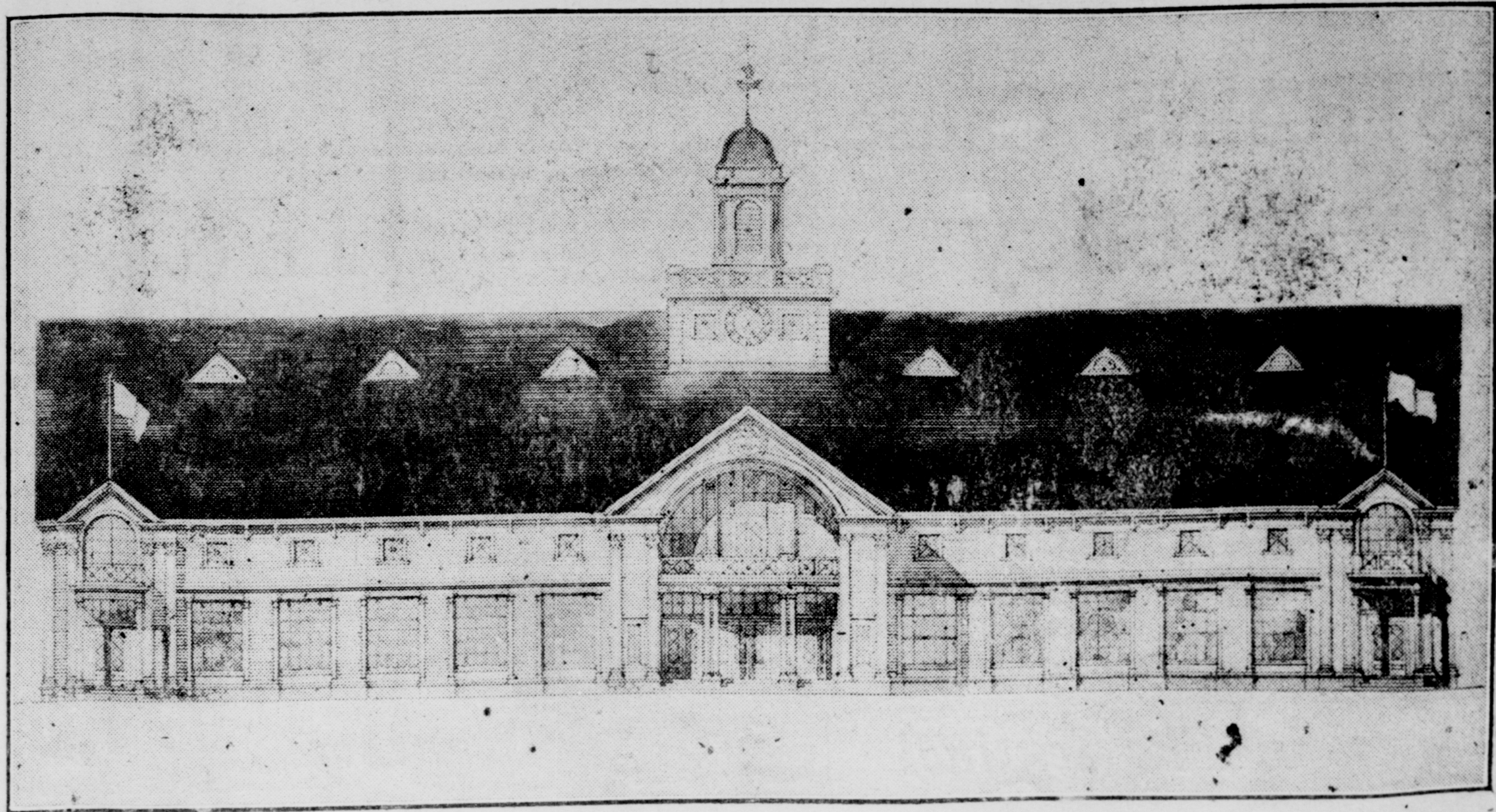
