He reported that the society adjourned to meet again on Nov. 18th, when it is expected that the owner of Williams Shows will meet the Society and arrange for amusements for a proposed carnival next summer.

Deduct \$35,000 bonds, will leave \$15,969.50 again deduct \$5,000 owed to us by the government and it leaves a balance due of \$10,969.50, on a plant estimated to be worth at least \$100,000, although the estimate by appraisers was made lower. 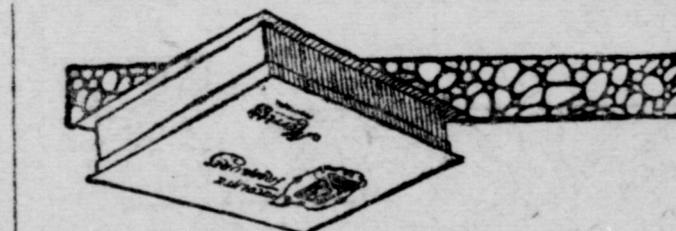
