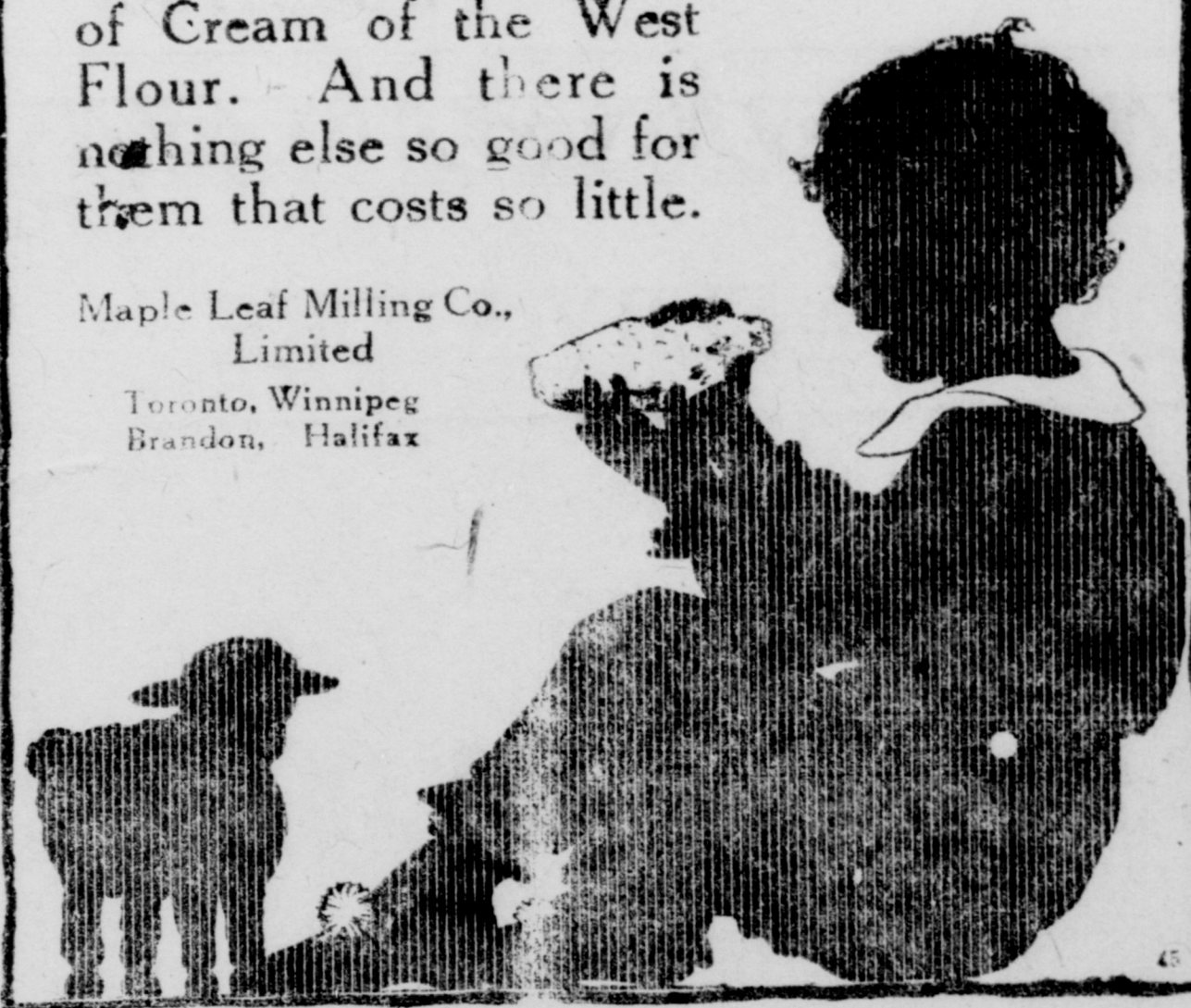

MR. FRANCIS GLIDDEN

An esteemed citizen passed away Wednesday morning at his home in the person of Francis Glidden, aged 88 years. He was able to do the work allotted to him at the factory of his sons up to a few days ago. He is survived by his widow, two daughters, Mrs. Green Davis of Alliance, Alberta, Mrs. Grace Smith of the post office staff, Woodstock; two sons, Frank and Charles, both of this town; two brothers, J. J. of Sebec, Me., and C. H. in Gladwin, Michigan. He and his esteemed wife were married over 50 years ago.

on July 24th, 1833, but came to Woodstock when a young man and has resided here ever since, where everybody was his friend. Away back in 1860, Colonel J. R. Tupper of Woodstock, had the contract to drive the stage from Grand Falls to Fredericton. He had as drivers Johnny Turner and Jimmie Hamilton, the latter retired and deceased took his place. After a while, the stage contract was given to Allan Perley from Woodstock to Grand Falls, and to George W. Vanwarwick and Israel Golding from Woodstock to Fredericton, deceased then, in 1865, in partnership with Augustus Gilman, started a livery stable, and upon the latter retiring, a relative, Wm. F. Glidden, was taken into partnership, and the business continued for many years. Generous and kind, his life was filled with usefulness, as with years and he will be greatly missed.

The funeral was held at 2.30 on Friday afternoon and was largely attended. Services were held at the house and grave by Revd's L. E. Ackland and F. S. Todd. The burial was in the Methodist cemetery, the pall bearers being H. V. Mooers, H. E. Bartt, L. H. McElhenny and C. L. Smith.
