HOULTON PACER DRAWN FROM ALL FALL RACES

Calgary Earl, the Houlton pacer with a record of 2:02 1/4, will race no more this season. During the whole season the horse's owner and the men who knew what the horse should do have been concerned with the way he performed when on the track. It has developed that the condition of the horse was not what it should be and his owner, L. H. Powers, has determined that he shall race no more till in condition.

John R. Braden, the Presque Isle stepper, who so repeatedly defeated the Earl horse this season will race for the remainder of the season on Massachusetts and New York tracks.

All this season track followers have been expecting to see Calgary Earl stretch out and show the speed that he has but never has the horse flattened out for a real race before spectators of a Maine-New Brunswick meet. That something was wrong with the pacer has been the opinion of many and some, even weeks ago, were heard to say that the horse should be drawn. Mr. Powers feels that the horse's condition can be bettered and regrets greatly that he had to draw his horse from the races in which he is now entered.—Houlton Pioneer.

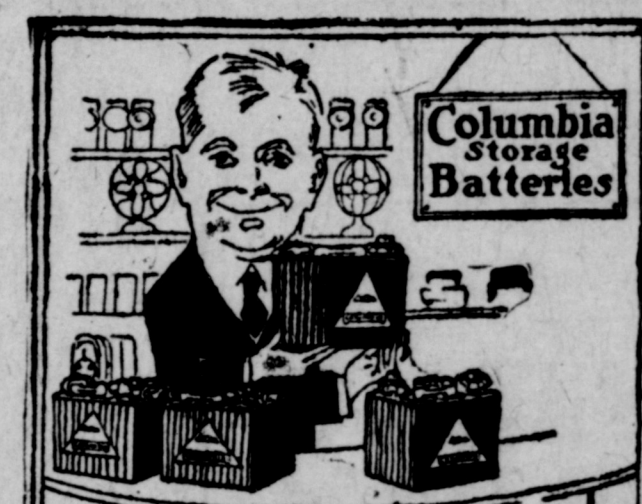
