A MARVEL AMONG RACE HORSES

New York, April 17—When the aged Exterminator, flashing the silks of William Sharpe Kilmer, thundered down the heavy home stretch of the race track at Havre de Grace last Saturday afternoon there was presented to the eyes of the spectators the ever thrilling picture of a stirring finish—a great race horse, ably handled, favorite, battling gamely and finally

creeping up, stride by stride, on the flashing past the winning post victor by a length. It was a notable performance, in itself, this capture of the Harford Handicap—the feature event on the opening day of the Havre de Grace Spring meeting, which marks the real beginning of high-class, thoroughbred racing in the East. It was the more remarkable in that Exterminator defeated, in Commander Ross's bay gelding, Billy Kelly, the three-time winner of the Harford, a great sprinter and holder of the track record for the distance of 1.11 1-5. Moreover, in the heavy going, the winners time was only three seconds slower than the record. It was, furthermore, probably unique in that the sprinter was outstripped by a cup horse beaten at his distance by the "monarch of American distance runners"

Exterminator is a marvel among race horses and his name is blazoned over the records of American racing. For the last three years in succession, he has captured the famous Saratoga

Cup, a feat unapproached by any other horse in the more than half century of the famous race at the Spa. Last

year, among other stakes, he accounted for the Autumn Golf Cup at Belmont Park, the Independent at Laconia, the Long Beach at Jamaica, the Merchants and Citizens' at Saratoga in addition to the Saratoga Cup, the Pimlico Cup at Pimlico, the Autumn at Empress holds two American distance records that are likely to stand for some time. At a mile and three quarters his figures are 2.56 2-5, which he established at Saratoga Springs on August 31, 1920—his fifth year—shouldering 126 pounds. At Belmont Park on September 15 of the same year, burdened with two additional pounds, he established the two-mile record of 3.21 4-5. He is a living refutation of the charge that America is breeding a race of thoroughbreds which cannot go a distance and yet he turns the tables on the sprinters. Is there no end to his possibilities, or will he, when he becomes a really old race horse, be trained over the timbers and be sent after the blue ribbon of the steeplechase world? Exterminator, at the end of the last racing season, had raised his total of winnings to \$173,129, to which on Saturday he added \$3,525. Of all the horses enrolled in the American Racing Manual, his name alone is prefixed by an asterisk, which means that he is still racing. Exterminator was fifth on the list last year, being topped only by those giants of the American turf history, Man o' War, Domino, Sysonby and Colin. Only twelve horses on the English turf have exceeded Exterminator's money-winning record. Mr. Kilmer, his owner, confidently expects that by the close of the 1921 racing season Exterminator's winnings will have passed \$200,000.

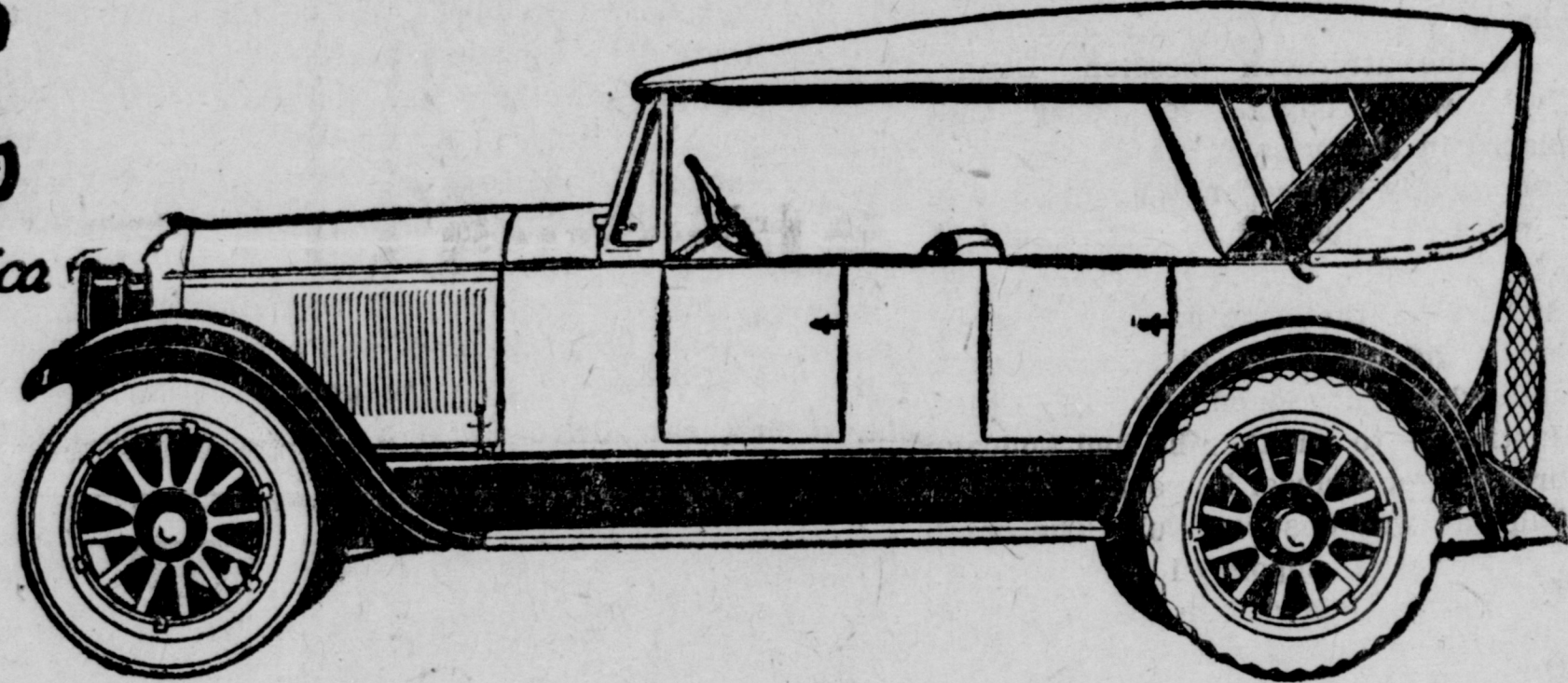
