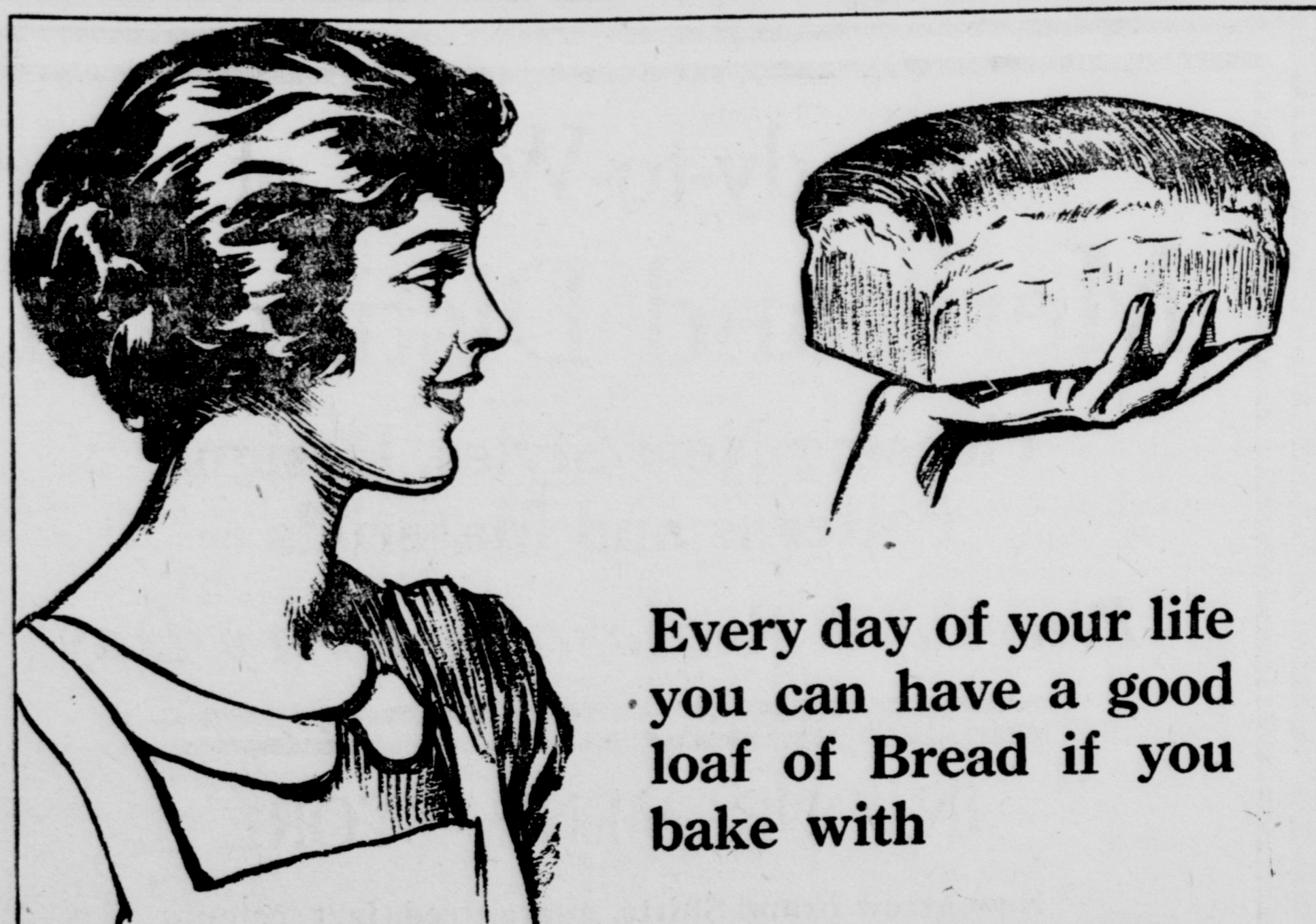

VOCATIONAL TRAINING

The case for vocational training was admirably stated by Mr. Edward T. Franks, a member of the Federal Board of Vocational Education in the United States, in an address delivered in Bangor. We quote one portion of his remarks:

"Sixty four per cent of all the boys and girls have left school before they reach the eighth grade. Why is it? Some on account of economic conditions, but the great majority of them leave because they are tired of school. Some of them want to go to the farm, others to the shop, others want to enter the commercial world, and others want to be home-builders, but it never has been, until recently, and only to a limited degree, that the boy who wants to do anything except be a professional man could find a place where he could receive a technical education for the calling that he had selected for his life's work. Put vocational education in your school. Let the boy or girl look over the field and see what he or she wants to do in the future, and train that boy or that girl along the lines of his or her wishes. If a boy wants to be a farmer, train him to be a farmer; if he wants to be a mechanic, train him to be a mechanic. If a girl wants to be a home-builder, train her to be a home-builder. If they want a commercial education, train them commercially. Vocational education does not interfere in any particular with the school systems as outlined now for the various states and local com-

munities. We want you to go ahead in the future and do as you have done in the past, except we want you to add vocational education."

In the course of his address, Mr. Franks gave one illustration of what vocational education may do for the farmer. It was as follows:

"Last year in Arkansas the vocational students kept books on five projects, corn, cotton, Irish potatoes, sweet potatoes and dairy products. If all the farmers in that state had produced the same yield in these five projects as the vocational students produced, it would have added to the wealth of the State over and above what these five articles did produce, \$155,000,000."

CIRCUIT RACING

The prospects for the season of 1923 are particularly bright and the outlook is for a circuit which will cover New Brunswick and Aroostook county tracks and fit in very nicely.

The opening of the circuit will be on July 4th, with meets at both Houlton and Carleton Place. Woodstock will follow with racing July 12th and 13th. The following week Fredericton will come in and St. Stephen will come after that. An open week will follow early in August.

The Aroostook county fairs then will start, the first being at Presque Isle, with Houlton and Fort Fairfield following. They will carry the racing pretty well into September when the fairs in New Brunswick will be in full swing. Woodstock will be the first with Fredericton next, and Chatham and Charlottetown filling in the rest of the month.

The Aroostook county tracks had a chance to ally themselves with other State of Maine racing interests but chose to stay with New Brunswick and the working arrangement will produce a great season with all the fast imported horses of the Upper St. John county competing on New Brunswick tracks.

Writing regarding Canada's national status, Mr. W. L. Smith expresses surprise "that 9,000,000 people, presumably intelligent and professedly self-respecting, can see nothing incongruous in permitting such a condition to continue." 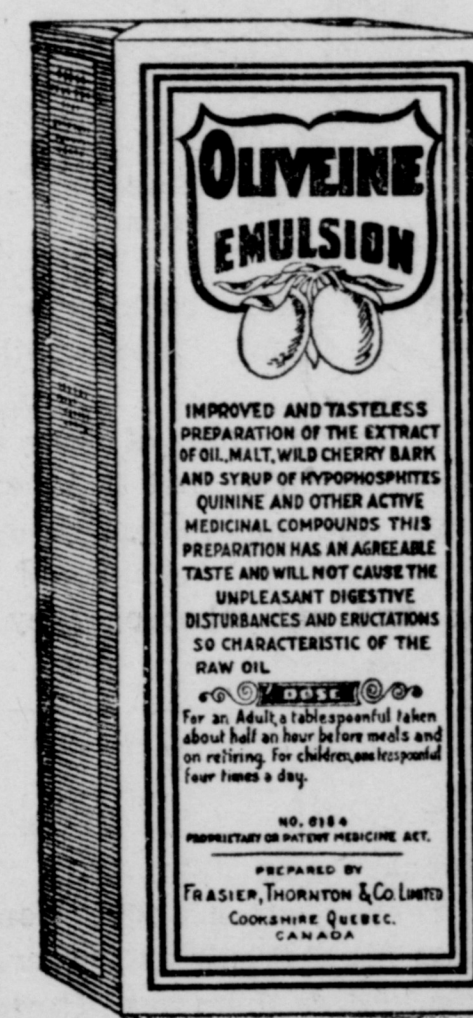
