WHY SO MANY MURDERS?

The tortuous and cumbersome methods of American court procedure in criminal trials as compared with those of Great Britain, with their effective simplicity, often have been commented upon, but rarely have there been better comparative illustrations of a concrete nature than those of the much-talked-of Mahon murder case in Lewes, England, and that of Leopold and Loeb in this country.

In less than five full days Patrick Henry Mahon was tried by a British Judge and jury in the Sussex Assizes for the murder of Miss Emily Kaye, found guilty and sentenced to be hanged. In this case legal technicalities were pushed aside, as they often are in British courts, and the murderer was tried and doomed to die in short order. But in the Leopold and Loeb case all manner of technical evidence and argument was admitted and the trial was strung out in a way to make those jealous of the claims of justice chafe with impatience.—Los Angeles Times.

CANADA AS A PLAYGROUND

Canada since the war has become almost a region of holidays and the Mecca of tourists. Visitors to the country in 1923 spent approximately \$136,000,000. Canada estimates that the revenue from tourists, which is a new source of income, has been brought with greater ease and rapidity than the revenue from the exploitation of any of the other great natural gifts of the Dominion. Persons acquainted with the mineral deposits, fisheries, fur-bearing regions and forests would not think of comparing the tourists' resources with them, but the statistics prepared by the Dominion Parks Board indicates that in a material sense the tourist traffic is worth more than the majority of them, since it is exceeded only by agriculture, mining, forestry and manufacturing. The revenue from fisheries, furs, electric power and construction is less than that from tourist traffic.

ORIGINAL MOUNTIES WHOOP 'ER UP

This was the only event which in any way tended to mar the Jubilee. A rodeo was held, some seventeen thousand visitors from all over the Continent helping the cowboys and cow-girls, and the Blackfeet, Blood and Peigan Indians, to "whoop 'er up." Three thousand automobiles parked in Main street and out on the open prairie, and for three nights the old-time dance halls remained open for the benefit of those who could not find accommodation in the town or in one of the sleeping cars which crowded the Canadian Pacific yards.

The Indians, who once terrorized the countryside, were encamped in vari-colored teepees in the centre of the town. Here they took part in the old-time war dances under the eyes of the remaining members of the original squadron of the "Royal North-West." Cowboys and Indians had to have their say, but after all, the event was mainly in honor of those who remembered the Fall of 1874 and were numbered with the "Mounties" who established Fort MacLeod. Grizzled old men, most of them, but young at heart, they entered into the spirit of the days and were as active as any in "Whooping 'er up."
