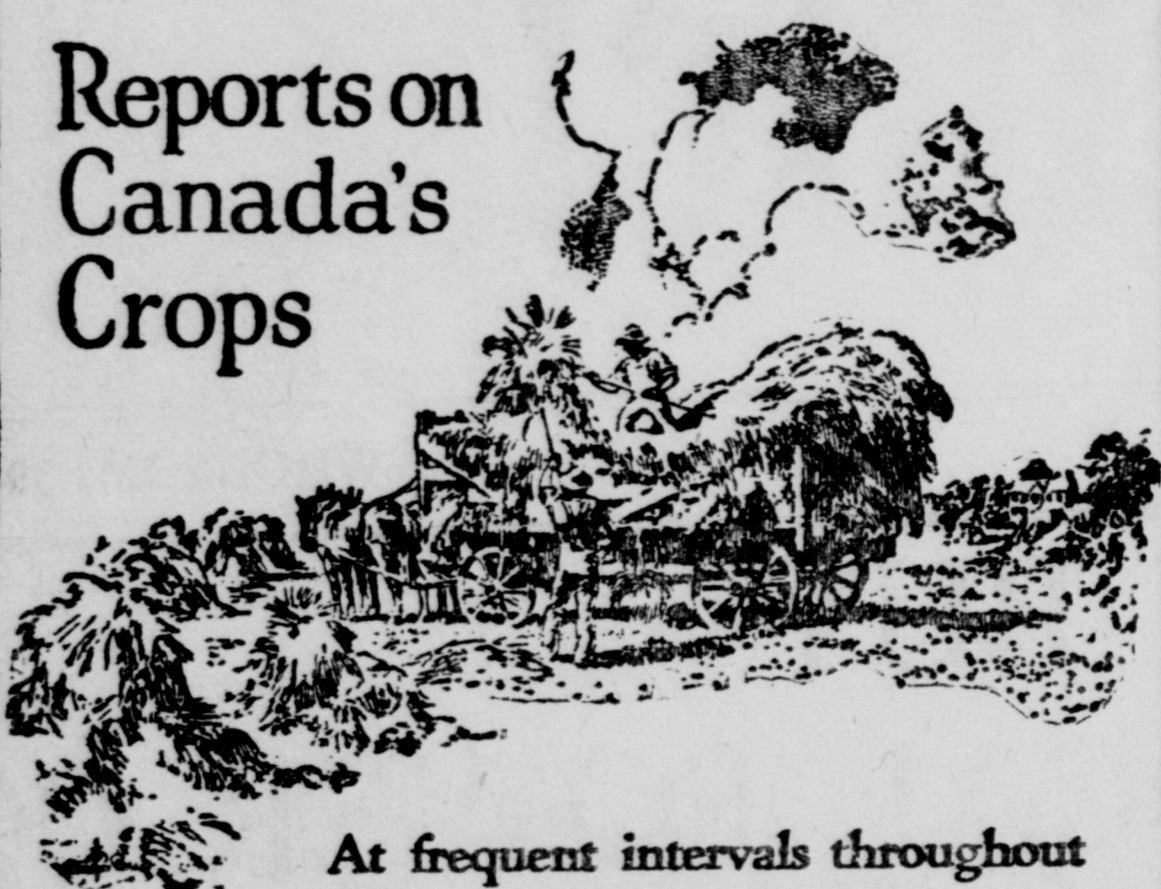


Reports on Canada's Crops

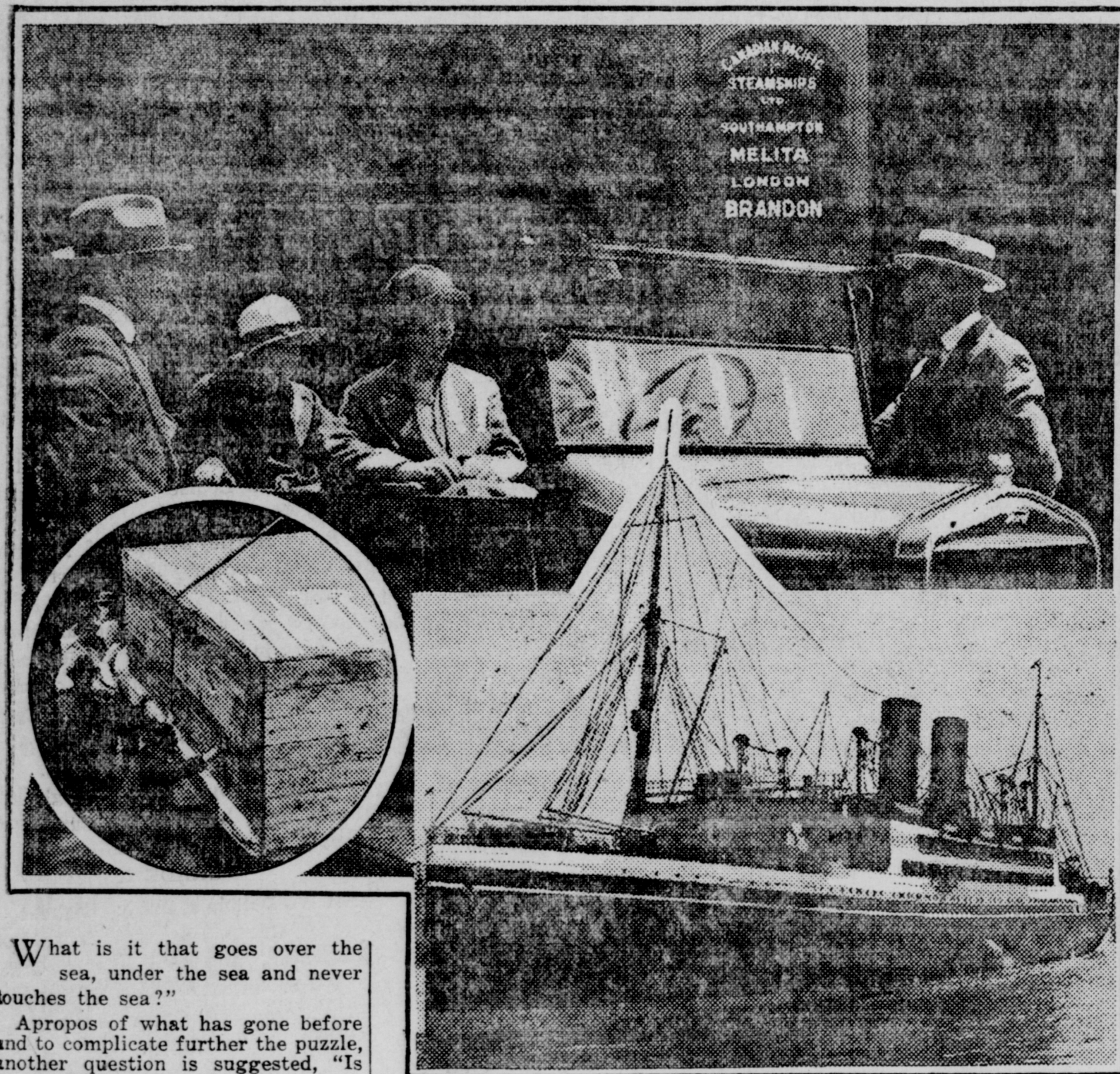

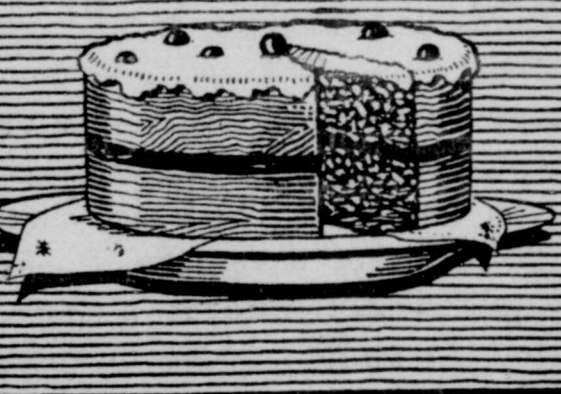

REASSURING TO PREMIER KING.

Saskatchewan, says Toronto Saturday Night, seems to have run true to its Liberal form and the first of the provincial try-outs is reassuring to Premier King. It is a straw which shows the direction of the political breezes. Mr. Dunning, who has held the premiership since the elevation of Hon. W. M. Martin to the bench, has long been regarded as a probable western addition to the federal cabinet. He is a splendid type of the Englishman who has succeeded in Canada by his own efforts. Oliver of British Columbia, Greenfield of Alberta, and Dunning of Saskatchewan, the trio of English-born provincial premiers, are splendid advertisements of the fact that here we have no mean country in which a man may rise to high office unaided save by his character and ability. Saskatchewan has been liberal in all its provincial leanings since it was admitted to the confederation family table in 1905. Walter Scott went from a seat in the Commons to the premier's chair, and he was followed years later, by W. M. Martin, one of the ablest of the younger band of Liberals who came from the west to support Sir Wilfrid, and who stood loyally by him in success and adversity. Mr. Dunning headed the government when Mr. Martin went to the bench and now he has won thru against his Progressive and Conservative opponents the political prophets are again foretelling his early advent to cabinet preferment at Ottawa.

MAZES AND BLIND ALLEYS

Toronto Saturday Night's political writer says Hon. Dr. Baxter's call to leadership of the provincial opposition "will hearten those who have for some time been leaderless." He adds "there is no gainsaying the fact that Dr. Baxter knows the mazes and blind alleys of New Brunswick politics." Why their political leader's knowledge of "the mazes and blind alleys of New Brunswick politics" should hearten his party supporters is not explained by the Toronto Saturday Night writer. It is clear, however, that he considers this knowledge one of Dr. Baxter's most valuable attributes for he assures Saturday Night readers that "by natural ability and training Dr. Baxter is well qualified to lead his party in the approaching election." Is the real meaning and the true significance of the Toronto comment on Hon. Dr. Baxter's knowledge of New Brunswick's "political mazes and blind alleys" to be found in the happenings of the few short weeks since he assumed leadership and began to apply that knowledge which there is no gainsaying? The very first evidence of this leadership was the reappearance in the political arena of Hon. James A. Murray as the financial expert of the opposition. The second and equally astonishing fact of Dr. Baxter's leadership was the nomination at a Carleton County convention, attended by Hon. Dr. Baxter himself, of Hon. B. Frank Smith as one of his supporters. That Carleton County nomination gave another proof of the "mazes and blind alleys" of New Brunswick politics in the appearance with Hon. Dr. Baxter of Hon. J. K. Flemming to support the appearance with Hon. Mr. Smith's choice as a candidate. A moment's thought over the reappearance into the political arena from which they had been driven by an outraged and indignant public of Messrs. Murray, Smith and Flemming is well calculated to give any conscientious voter, concerned over the administration of this province, an understanding of the true significance of the coming New Brunswick contest. Whether the men who are now coming to the front as the lieutenants and the champions of Hon. Dr. Baxter's leadership are the men who called him from the federal arena, or whether they are being called by him, the Globe does not know. What everyone does know, however, is that they are political leaders who were driven from office and from public life by an indignant electorate. The reason they were driven from office and from public life is written in the records of the potato scandal and the timber scandal. It is a further fact that these men were not heard from politically during the years that Mr. Palmer and Mr. Richards led the provincial opposition. Not only do they come back to life and activity with the return to provincial politics of their former associate, Hon. Dr. Baxter, but they are the very first to appear on the scene as his friends, his colleagues, his advisors. With him they join in saying do not trust Veniot to develop Grand Falls but let us have the spending of those millions. If the history of the past is the indication of the future, the meaning and significance of that Toronto Saturday Night assurance that "there is no gainsaying the fact that Dr. Baxter knows the mazes and blind alleys of New Brunswick politics" requires no other comment.—St. John Globe.
