Women Enthusiastic Over New Buick

McLaughlin-Buick's thousands of women admirers are likely to find the 1928 car one over which to wax enthusiastically. Not only in its style but in its ease of handling and its provision for the comfort of driver and passengers, the new car is noteworthy.

The refinements made in the driving compartment of the 1928 cars are now supplemented by additional changes, which will appeal to women as well as to men. For example, the car is now fully adaptable to the requirements of an individual. Its adjustable steering column, introduced last year, is retained and the front seat, in every closed model is now adjustable also. It may be shifted 3½ inches, to accommodate a driver of any stature. This adjustment is accomplished with one hand, by means of a small hand knob located just below the front edge of the seat cushion, and can be made without disturbing either driver or passenger. The seat automatically locks in any one of seven positions within its range of adjustment.

Another refinement is the electric windshield wiper with tandem blades, standard equipment on all closed models. This type of wiper not only maintains an even speed regardless of the engine speed, but cleans the entire windshield, in front of the passenger as well as the driver. It is connected with the ignition switch in such a way that shutting off the engine stops the wiper, a provision which prevents discharging the battery through accidental failure to turn off the device when the engine is stopped.

Still another driving compartment improvement is the new instrument panel, with its new grouping of instruments. The panel is provided with two-way illumination, and accommodates the 90-mile speedometer—directly in front of the driver—the oil gauge, water, temperature gauge, and the new hydrostatic gasoline gauge, a simple application of an old principle, of registering the height of the gasoline in

the tank. The gearshift lever in the new McLaughlin-Buick is of graceful design, and curves back toward the driver. As in the 1928 car, there is no control for which the driver must reach. Everything is within easy distance of hand or foot. Light controls are centralized atop the steering column as formerly, along with the horn button.

Drivers accustomed to spend much time on the road will appreciate the new accelerator pedal and foot rest, which are so designed as to permit movement of the right foot while driving, without affecting the speed of the car. The new front compartment ventilators—small doors in the cowl just forward of the front doors, and on a level with the feet—also will appeal. They are operated easily by a slight pressure of the foot.

McLaughlin-Buick is introducing something new in the way of theft-resisting door handles. In the 1929 lines, while a would-be thief may force the handle with a wrench or piece of pipe, it will give without allowing access to the car, and the owner may still unlock the door with his key.

A new and pleasing pattern has been worked out for the interior hardware, and improved robe and foot rails are provided in the rear compartment. Easier cushions, wider rear seat, and carpets and side wall lining of high grade materials complete the most comfortable and luxurious ensemble McLaughlin-Buick has ever offered.

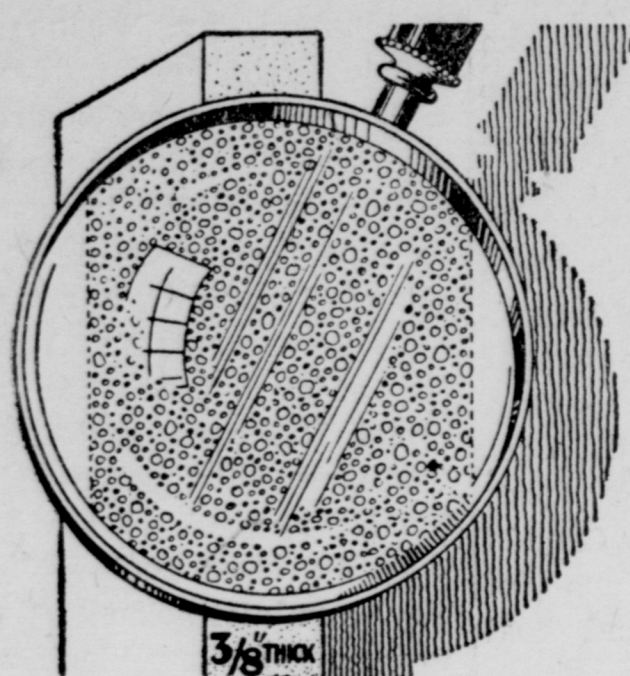

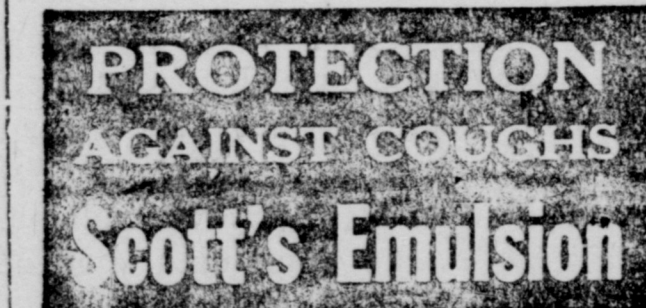

MRS. MARTHA ESTEY

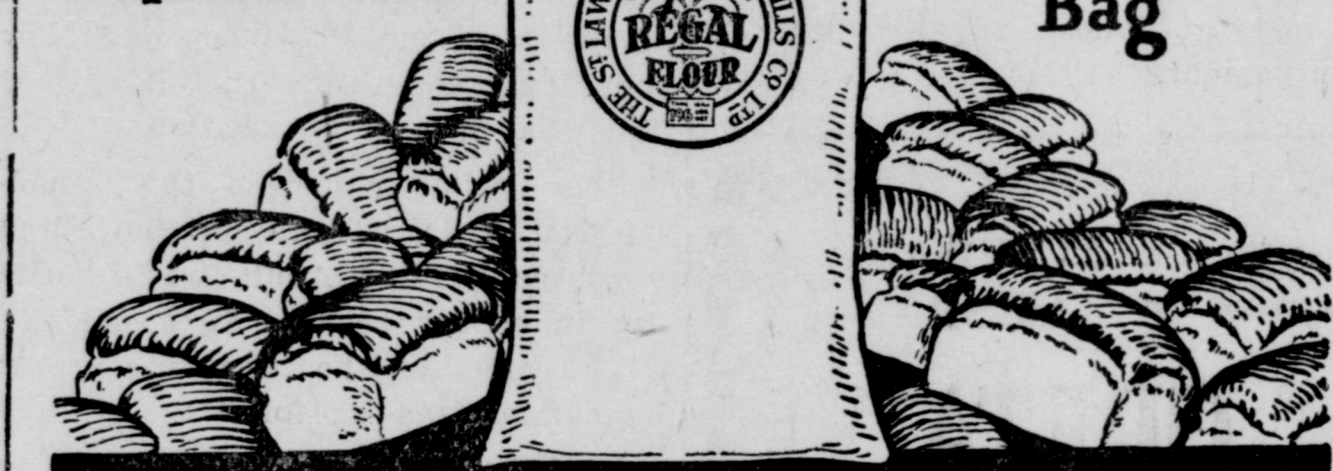

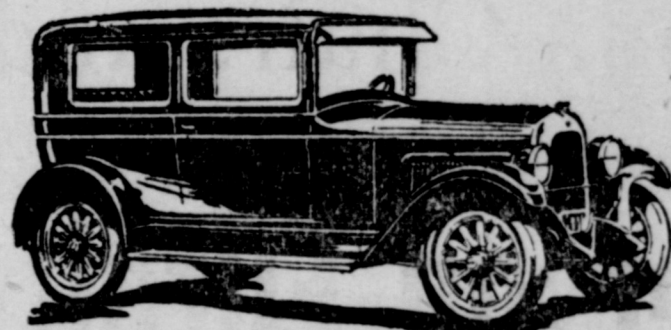
