FREE TEXT BOOKS FOR ALL GRADED SCHOOLS IN N. B.

Free school books for all scholars attending the public schools of New Brunswick up to and including Grade VIII was adopted as the policy of the Government of the Province at a Cabinet meeting in regard to the most important connection with educational matters in New Brunswick since the free public school system was introduced many years ago, for it comes nearer to putting education for the practical purposes of all families on a free basis than anything else that has ever occurred.

More than thirty thousand school children of the Province will get free text books as a result of the new order, which is made operative from the commencement of the present school term, adequate means being provided for refunds and the compensation of those who have already made expenditures. The recent changes in texts, the Government contends, were made necessary by after-the-war conditions and, it is pointed out, the new texts were adopted in conferences with representatives of the other Maritime Provinces.

The official statement outlining what has been done follows:

The Government of New Brunswick, September 21st, took the most advanced step which has been taken since the introduction of the free public school system when they made free from the beginning of the present school term all school textbooks sold and distributed through the school-book department, from Grade 1 to Grade VIII both inclusive. "Each pupil in these grades will hereafter be entitled to one copy of

each text free; but, in case of loss of a book during the period covered by the grades for which it is prescribed, the pupil will have to pay for its replacement.

"The Government has had this step under consideration for some time but until the new texts were provided it was impossible to make a sufficiently accurate estimate of the Province at the close of the present fiscal year. When all available information was obtained it was obtained it was felt that the Government could at present go as far as Grade VIII leaving other grades for future consideration when the results of this step are more fully worked out.

"The Secretary of each school district will at once be asked to return the name and address of each teacher employed for the current school term and the number of children at present supplied in made up for each grade which will each school. Printed forms will contain a list of the text-books for use in that grade with the selling price against each book. The teacher will then certify on a form or each pupil the books purchased for this term for the pupil and give the name of the parent or guardian to whom a refund is to be made. These forms must be sent in before the close of the present school term and cheques will be forthwith sent to the persons entitled to them."

GROWTH IN CANADA'S MINERAL INDUSTRY

Official statistics on Canada's mineral production for the half-year ending June 30, 1928, just released by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa, show a continuance of the prosperous conditions that prevailed throughout 1927. Records for 1927 set new high marks in the production of gold, copper, lead and zinc, coal, cement, lime and gypsum. During the half-year ending June 30, 1928, the value of metals and non-metals produced from Canadian ores at \$105,631,571 surpassed the recorded output value for the first half of 1927 by nearly 7 million dollars.

Employment in the mining industry during the period ranged about 7 per cent higher this year than last and in metal mining and non-metal mining the improvement was in the neighbourhood of 15 per cent over the records for the first half year. Gold, copper, nickel, lead silver and zinc were the principal metals but in addition to these there were outputs of Canadian (reported for the first time), arsenic, bismuth, cobalt, iron ore, platinum and rhodium.

Coal was the chief product in fuels and non-metallic mineral field. Other non-metals of importance besides petroleum and natural gas were asbestos, gypsum, salt, perlite, feldspar, magnesite, talc and soapstone. Many other minerals were produced in less amounts as, for example, actinolite, barytes, bituminous sands, diatomite, garnets, graphite, mica, mineral waters, natron, alunite, phosphate, pyrites, sodium carbonate and sulphate, volcanic dust and silica brick.

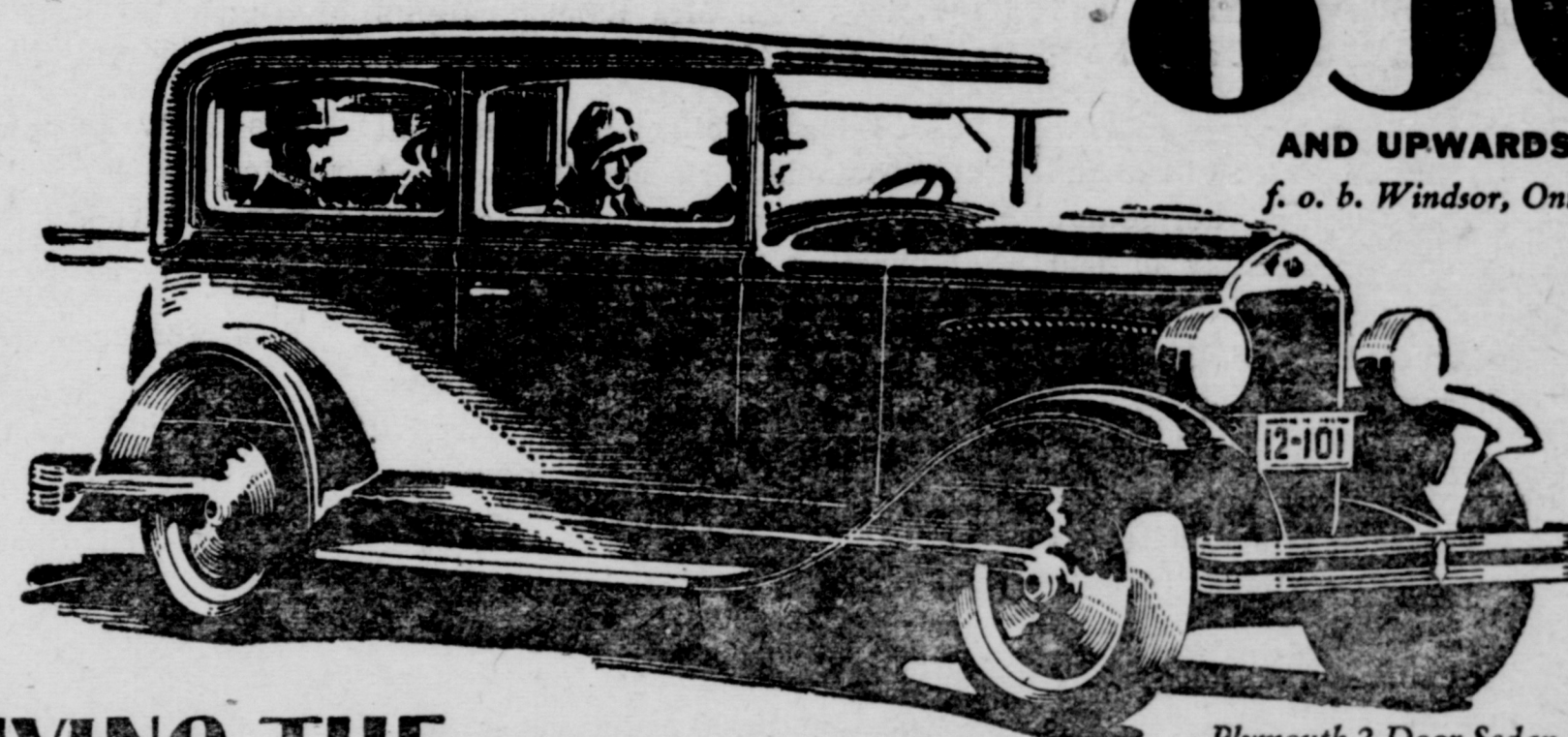

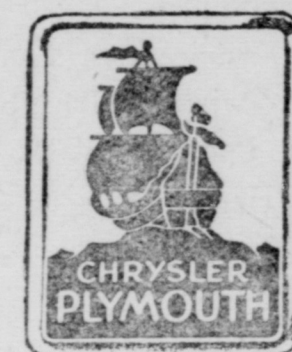
