Woodstock Fall Fair Will Open on Sept. 8 and Continue Four Nights and Three Days

Renovation Work is Rapidly Nearing Completion with Indications Favoring Bigger Show Than Ever; Three Day Horse Racing Meet is Carded

Big Fireworks Display Nightly and Daily Vaudeville Acts; Better Accommodations are being Prepared for Performers; Roof of Main Building being Fixed.

Renovation work on the Woodstock Exhibition buildings at the famous Island Park is being rushed to completion in preparation for the opening of the big fall fair next month. The roof of the main building is being repaired, extra lavatories installed, improved accommodations are being prepared for the vaudeville performers, and a special house is being built to house the fireworks for the brilliant pyrotechnic display that is planned each night.

The fair will open on the evening of September 8 and will continue until the night of September 11.

HOULTON PLANS BIG RACE MEET FOR EXHIBITION

Good Free For All and Farmers' Races on Program.

Houlton, Aug. 14.—The thousands of race fans from Aroostook County and the Maritime Provinces who will attend the 19th annual Houlton Fair, August 26, 27 and 28 for the races alone, will not be disappointed in the program that has been arranged by Race Secretary Bud Tingley.

For one thing, a real old fashioned Free-for-all race is in the process of forming this week to revive if possible the interest of race fans of this section in this type of race. As an incentive, Bonnie M. (2.03) will be one of the starters. Others will include Bob Seymour, Peter Patch and many of the other headliners who have been setting up fast times all over the circuit this season.

The Big Airship Wings Her Way Over Atlantic

Reported Passing Over Straits of Belle Isle at Noon Thursday

MAKING FAST TIME
WITH WEATHER GOOD

Gifts for King George and Prince of Wales Are on Board.

Montreal, P. Q., Aug. 14.—The dirigible R. 100 is homeward bound. The big airship was reported passing over the Straits of Belleisle at noon today, and this evening she is flying steadily over the Atlantic ocean. The trip from the mooring mast at St. Hubert down the St. Lawrence river and across the gulf was made at a speed of 60 miles an hour, with weather conditions favorable. A higher altitude and slightly lower speed was being maintained when last reports were received.

Although requests to carry freight were declined by her officers, two packages were taken on board here, flowers from the Governor-General for King George and a basket of peaches for the Prince of Wales.
