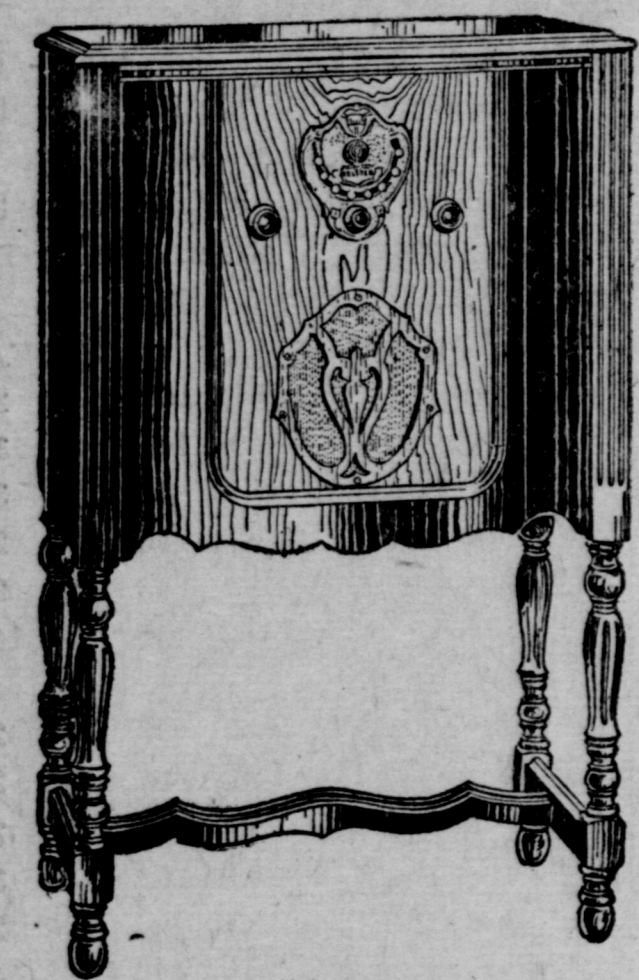

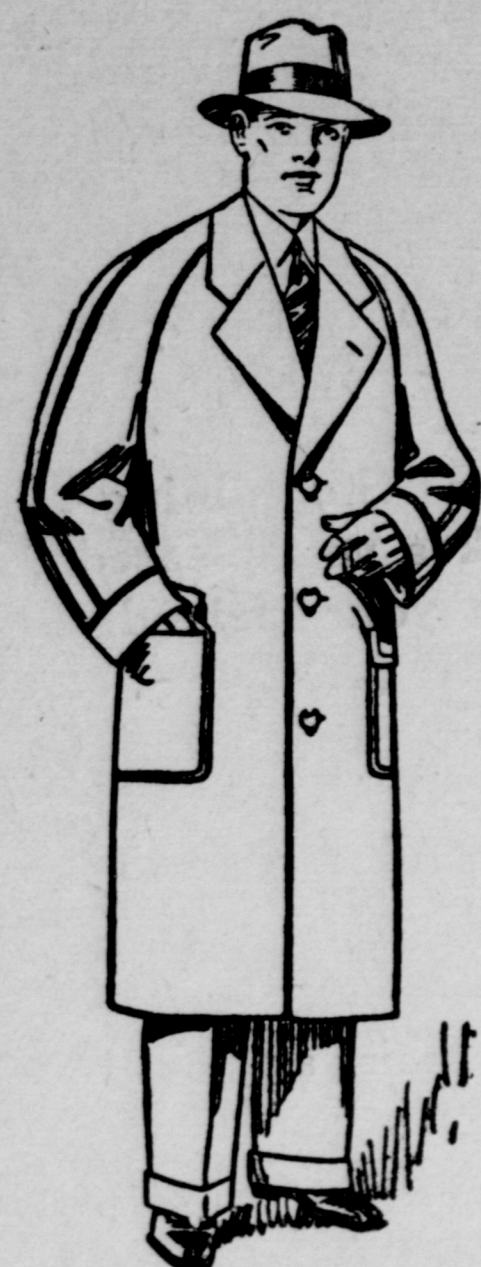

CAUSES OF PALESTINE RISING

(Reprinted from Montreal Standard)

The trouble in Palestine has been brewing for some time; the Jews were the aggressors in the first place. On August 15, a Jewish fast, a demonstration of young Jews went to the Wailing Wall and there read out resolutions which had been passed at a previous demonstration at the Jewish colony of Tel-Aviv, "protecting against the failure of the Palestine Government to safeguard the Jewish rights of free and undisturbed worship at the Wall, as guaranteed by the Mandate." (Statement by Zionist Organization.) This demonstration passed off without incident, under police protection. On Friday, 16th, being the Moslem Sunday, when the Mosque of Omar is full of worshippers from outlying villages as well as from Jerusalem itself, the Government permitted a Moslem procession to take place, which passed by the Wall, scattering Jewish Wallers on its way. Police protection was given also to this demonstration, and the police tried to prevent the Jews at the Wall from being hustled, but they were too few to control the situation. On Saturday excited young Moslems passed by the Wall from time to time, disturbing the Jews at their prayers, but not molesting them; this was stopped by the Government before midday on the Zionist Executive in Jerusalem protesting to the Acting High Commissioner. It was a serious error to allow a Jewish demonstration, whose object was to censure the Government; but having allowed so much to the Jews, the Moslems in common fairness had to be allowed the same freedom of action. It should be noted that the Jewish demonstration was anti-Government and the Moslem anti-Jewish.

The Sacred Wall

The Wailing Wall does not belong to the Jews; it contains stones from their ancient Temple, just as all over Palestine stones from ruins of Jewish, Roman, Herodian, and Crusading structures are used in modern buildings; one can tell their periods by the way in which they are cut. But for long years the Jews have been allowed to wall for the departed glory of Israel leaning against these sacred stones; aged Jews would often feel the ceremony intensely, whilst others would use the occasion for begging from tourists who regularly came to see the walling on Fridays, as one of the sights of Jerusalem. The Wailing wall forms part of the wall of the Mosque of Omar at Jerusalem, and this Mosque is one of the most sacred Moslem shrines in the world; every year thousands of Moslem pilgrims come here to worship after they have been to Mecca. We have thus a wall which actually belongs to the Moslems, one side of which is extremely sacred to Moslems and the other sacred to Jews. The Turks allowed the Jews to wall here, but never to introduce seats, barriers, or any fittings which would make it into a place of worship and thereby constitute a claim; any claim made up on any portion of the Mosque property would be fiercely resisted by Moslems throughout the world, irrespective of race or class. Under the Turks, aged or weakly Jews brought little stools to sit on, or else sat upon the ground. Some few months ago, the Jews were allowed to bring certain accessories, thereby infringing the wafk. What is a wafk? Roughly speaking, it is a religious entail; property, whether land, building, or a money bequest can be made wafk which, according to a Turkish jurist, is "the tying up of a property itself and the imposition of an interdiction on its transfer in such a way that its benefit is given to men on the condition that the property is regarded as the property of God." (See "Mohammedan Wakfs in Palestine," Barron.) Income or benefits derived from the thing made wafk are devoted to various charitable or religious purposes which are carefully defined in the Deed of Wafk, and all wafk are registered in the Department of Awqaf (pl). When the Prophet was asked by his dear Companion Omar how Omar could devote a portion of land to pious uses, he replied: "The up the property and devote the usufruct to human beings, and it is not to be sold or made the subject of gift or inheritance; devote its produce to your children, your kindred, and the poor in the way of God." ("Personal Law of the Mohammedans," Syed Amir Ali.)

NEW PAPER MILL TO BE OPENED AT DALHOUSIE

INTERNATIONAL PAPER COMPANY'S FIRST PLANT IN NEW BRUNSWICK, WHICH WILL BE THE LARGEST FOREST PRODUCTS INDUSTRY IN THE MARITIME PROVINCES.

Fredericton, N. B., January 20th, 1930.—The International Paper Company's first newsprint mill in New Brunswick, which has been constructed at Dalhousie at the mouth of the Restigouche river and will be the largest paper manufacturing plant in the Maritime Provinces, will be formally opened on Friday, February 14th, with the appropriate ceremonies.

Hon. John B. M. Baxter, Premier of New Brunswick, will throw open the switch which will set the wheels of this immense new plant in operation and which will keep New Brunswick in the lead of the Maritime Provinces in Canada's newsprint production. The first newsprint mill in the Maritime Provinces was that at Bathurst now owned by Bathurst Power & Paper Company, and the new plant at Dalhousie will be this Province's most important forest products industry.

Operated by electric power carried across the north of the Province from Grand Falls on the Saint John river by a transmission line more than 100 miles in length, New Brunswick International Paper Company's first plant at Dalhousie is designed for an ultimate daily capacity of 500 tons of newsprint paper. It will have an initial installation for a daily output of 250 tons. There will be complete groundwood and sulphite pulp-making departments at this plant, so that wood will be carried through all the various manufacturing processes, leaving as newsprint paper.

President A. R. Crautstein of International Paper Company accompanied by a party of executives of the company will come from New York for the opening of the new mill. Sir Henry Thornton, President of Canadian National Railways, and Mr. E. W. Beatty, President of Canadian Pacific Railway, are among those who have been invited to attend the ceremonies and if they are able to be present they will be among the speakers. The program will be broadcast under arrangements completed by the New Brunswick Bureau of Information with Canadian National Railways radio system. Special trains will carry the official guests of International Paper Company from the important centres of the Province to Dalhousie for the opening ceremonies on February 14th.

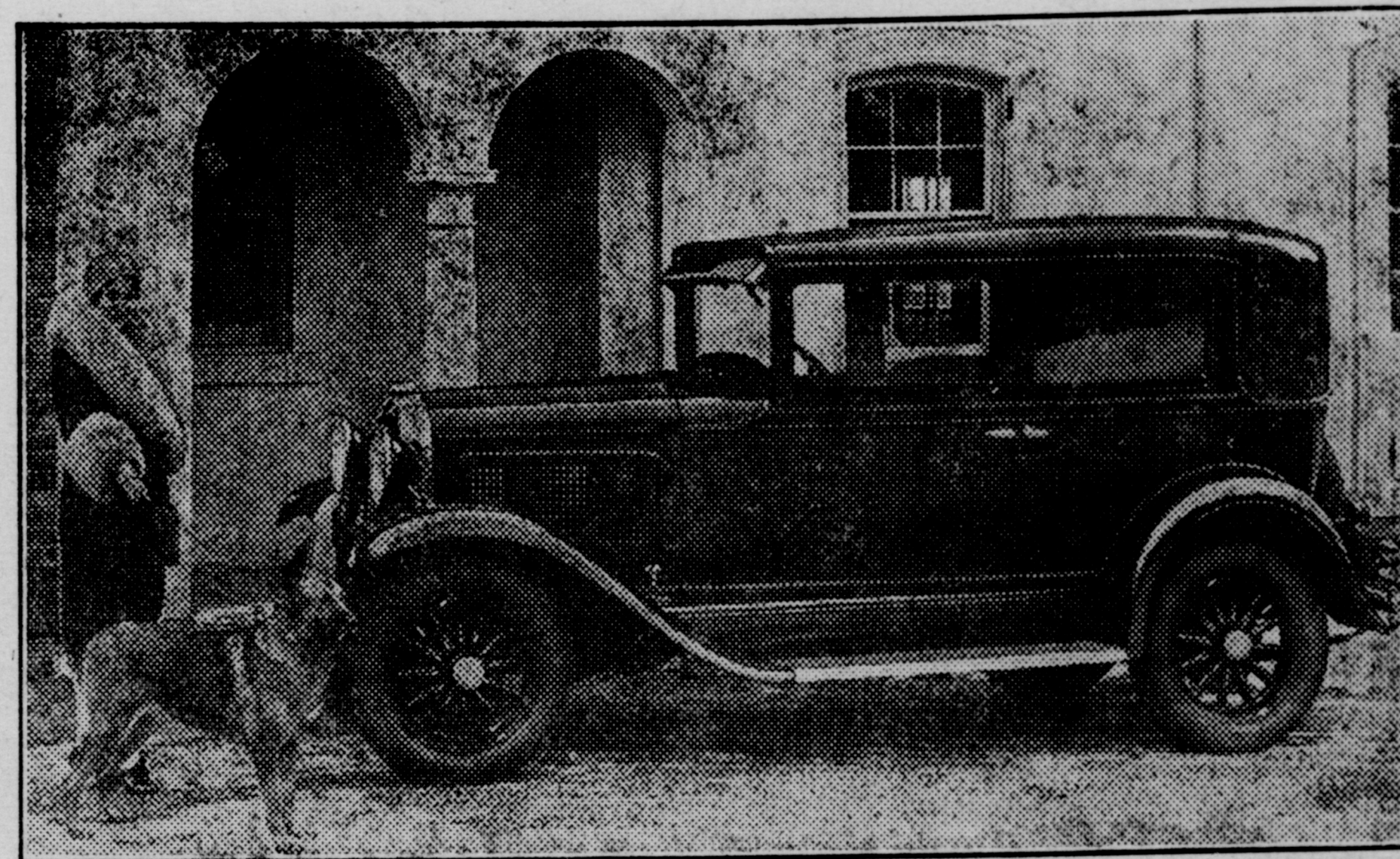
