Veniot Protests Cut in Service

POSTMASTER-GENERAL OBJECTS
VIGOROUSLY TO TRAIN
REDUCTION

Saint John, April 20.—Hon. Peter J. Veniot, Postmaster General, who was in Saint John Saturday, has made a vigorous protest to the Canadian National Railway's management, it was stated, against any curtailment of service on the Saint John Valley Railway, that would give a tri-weekly instead of a daily service.

Hon. Mr. Veniot, when asked what steps he had taken in the matter, said that he had written to Sir Henry Thornton on April 12, protesting against any change, but as Sir Henry was in the West Indies, he has not received an answer as yet.

Hon. Mr. Veniot said that the protest was based on two grounds, first, that the post office department had a contract with the railway for a daily mail service between Saint John and Fredericton, and, secondly, that the people of these two cities and intervening territory should have a daily railway accommodation.

Asked as to the date of the federal election, Hon. Mr. Veniot said that this matter was in the hands of the Premier. The question has not yet been discussed by the cabinet, he declared.

Hon. Mr. Veniot left Saturday evening for Bathurst, where he will remain until next Friday, when he will return to Ottawa.

DECISIONS GIVEN

Among the decisions given last week by the Appeal Court of New Brunswick were the three liquor cases H Y Tommy, Frank Kinney, and John McKinley from Woodstock who were convicted by the Magistrate for illegal sale of liquor last fall. On the appeal before the County Court Judge the Magistrate's convictions were set aside. The Crown then appealed to the Appeal Court of the Province on the question of law, as to whether a Police Officer was an accomplice. The appeals were allowed in two of the cases and dismissed in the other. This will likely settle the question as to whether a police officer is in the same category as an ordinary witness. The Crown represented by G W Montgomery and before the Appeal Court by the Attorney General who claimed the officer was not and the Defendants represented by R P Hartley argued contra.

OBITUARY

JAMES H. CROCKET

Death on Thursday afternoon claimed the third veteran in the field of journalism in the three Maritime Provinces in two weeks—one from each province—in the person of Jas. H. Crockett, president and managing director of The Gleaner, Ltd., which he founded a half century ago and which, under his skillful direction has grown into the leading daily newspaper in the central section of New Brunswick.

Following closely the passing of C. C. Blackader, publisher of The Acadian Recorder, Halifax, who died at the age of 82 on April 6, and that of John E. B. McCready, at Charlottetown, who, at the age of 91 was still an active editorial writer for the Charlottetown Guardian, who, at the age of 91 was still an active editorial writer for the Charlottetown Guardian until within six weeks of his death on April 15, Mr Crockett succumbed at 3.50 p. m. this afternoon at his home in Salamanca. Had he lived until Sunday he would have been 71 years of age. Mr Crockett was taken ill with bronchitis about two weeks ago, death being due to the development of complications.
