It is up to the various boards of trade and town and county councils to do their part in urging the claim of this part of the country in no uncertain manner. Otherwise it may well be that some work that will do no good here and will be less important to the province may be undertaken because it more strongly urged upon the government.

ACTION DELAYED

That no action has been taken in this matter by the present Dominion Government is shown by the answer made by the Deputy Minister of Railways, V. I. Smart, in reply to questions put by the Hon. P. J. Veniot on Sept. 19. The questions and answers are as follows:

1. "Has any survey been made of the extension of the St. John and Quebec Railway from Centreville to Grand Falls, New Brunswick?"

2. If so, has any report been made on such survey, and is it favorable to the extension?"

3. Is it the intention of the Government to expend any part of the \$20,000,000 voted by Parliament for the relief of unemployment in the construction of the railway extension?"

ANSWER

"1. While a reconnaissance survey has been made by the railway authorities, no decision has been reached in the matter of the possible extension of this road. In any event, authority of parliament would require to be secured before the Canadian National Railways, which acquired the St. John and Quebec Railway under the 1929 legislation, could build the forty miles of line

involved in proposed extension."

It is considered that the deputy minister framed his reply in the above terms so to prevent committing the government to action. There seems to be no necessity for any special act to be passed by Parliament if Premier Bennett knew what he was talking about when he stated in Parliament that the Governor-General in Council would have ample power to decide how, when and where the \$20,000,000 in question would be expended.

EXTENSION OF LINE

R. will carry out both plans and the Valley Railway work is the more important for several reasons. To begin with the McGivney plan would necessitate the reconstruction of the railway bridge at Fredericton, which itself would be a long and costly undertaking. Then the railway in that district runs through a wilderness, serving no populated areas and with no freight or passenger traffic originating, except non-perishable forest products.

The country between Centreville and Grand Falls, on the other hand is a populous farming district. A railway through there would not only provide a connecting link between two important rail branches but would handle a considerable amount of freight and passenger business or igniting right there. Moreover a considerable proportion of the originating freight in this district is perishable.

As is well known a survey was made of this route a few months ago and it is understood that the engineers reported favorably. An announcement was expected that the work would be undertaken, but in the meantime the government changed. Now is the time to take steps to see that the new government goes on with the work and at the same time provides employment at a critical time.

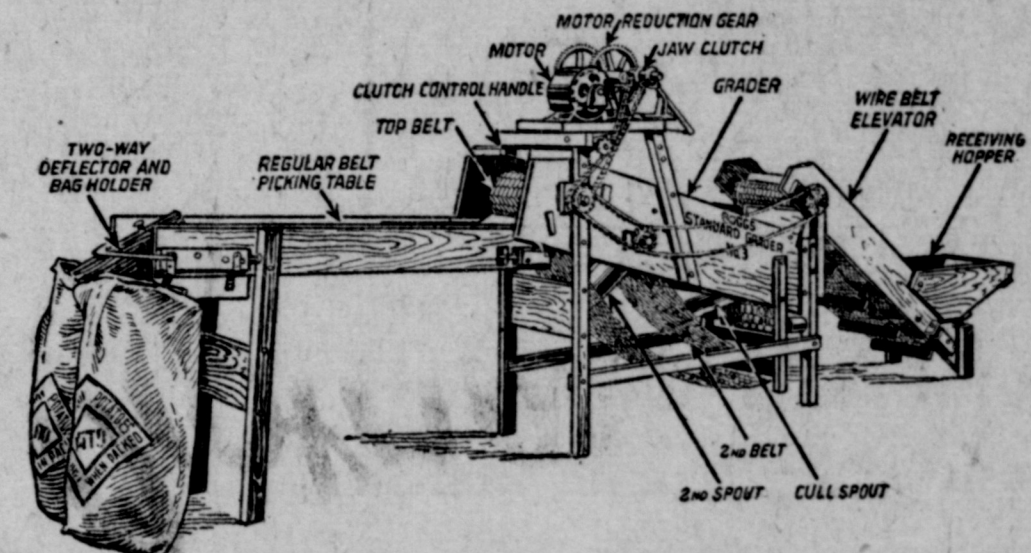
