Repatriation of
Canadians From
United States

152 FAMILIES HAVE ALREADY
RETURNED AND MORE
COMING

Montreal, Que. May 5—More than two thousand French-Canadians who have been domiciled in the United States have made plans to return to Canada, according to Mgr. J. H. Prohomme, Bishop of Prince Albert, Sask., who is in Montreal, having returned from Nashua, N. H., where he was the guest of Rev. Father A. S. Deschênes, Colonization Missionary representing the Province of Quebec in New England. Between January and April 1 this year, His Grace said, 152 families, comprising 672 persons, had re-established themselves in Quebec. "Father Deschênes, who gives me these figures," he added, "tells me that the families had a capital of \$202,565. The movement back to Canada and the growing tendency on the part of our people in the most encouraging." During his trip to the United States to join home is to the United States, Bishop Prohomme, was accompanied by Rev. Father Albert Forcier, Assistant to Rev. Father Prohomme, and by J. A. LaForce General Agent of the Canadian National Railways.

LARGEST FLAGPOLE ARRIVES
IN MONTREAL FROM
VANCOUVER

Montreal, Que. May 5—Bringing with it one of the largest flagpoles ever to be set up in Canada, the Canadian National steamship "Canadian Ranger" reached Montreal, the first vessel to arrive in this port this season from Vancouver. Coming by way of the Panama Canal, the "Ranger", Captain W. H. Miller, brought 3,850,000 feet of British Columbia timber and 1,000 tons of other cargo. "The Big Stick", as the seamen called it, was taken out of the forest at Port Alberni, on Vancouver Island. It is 120 feet long and weighs, it is estimated, between two and three tons. The gift of the H. R. MacMillan Export Company to the Lumbermen's Order of Hoo Hoo, it will be presented by the latter to the City of Montreal.

When it is hoisted up to the summit of Mount Royal, it will be visible over the whole city and it will be used on public occasions. Under the Union Jack will be flown the Hoo Hoo Black flag. At an informal luncheon held on board the "Ranger", before the pole was unloaded, U. E. Germain, President of the Hoo Hoo in Quebec, thanked the Canadian National Steamships, on behalf of the lumbermen, for transporting the great stick. Among those present were James E. Green, local Manager of the MacMillan Co.; W. Duncan, well known lumber importer and Capt. E. E. Tedford, Marine Superintendent, Canadian National Steamships.

The "Ranger" inaugurates, for this season, fortnightly freight service between Montreal and Vancouver via the Panama.

Forest Products
Are Estimated

LATEST ESTIMATE PLACES RE-
SOURCES AT MORE THAN
224 BILLION FEET

Ottawa May 4—An estimate of the total forest production of Canada for 1928 has just been made by the Forest Products Branch of the Dominion Bureau of Statistics. The estimate includes all the products of operations in the woods, the unmanufactured materials cut in Canadian forests during the year.

An estimate has also been made of the extent to which the forests are being depleted annually in the process of exploiting these materials. For this purpose converting factors based on actual measurements have been used. Each of these factors represents in cubic feet the quantity of standing timber that must be cut in the forest in order to produce one unit of the material in question, based on the cubic contents of the tree.

By the use of these factors it has been estimated that the total forest production of 1928 involved the cutting of 2,988,038,430 cubic feet of standing timber. This constitutes only annual depletion for use and to it must be added the volume of material annually destroyed by fire, which exceeds 900,000,000 cubic feet of merchantable timber and young growth of 1,300,000 acres. Insects and fungi destroy annually at least 800,000,000 cubic feet so the annual drain on the forest resources is considerably more than 4,788,000,000 cubic feet.

The latest available estimate places Canada forest resources at 224,304,000,000 cubic feet of standing timber which is capable of yielding 424,637,000,000 feet board measure of sawn lumber and 1,121,993,000 cords of pulpwood, ties, poles and other smaller materials.

A total depletion of 4,778,000,000 cubic feet per annum does not necessarily simply that the total resources are reduced by that amount every year and the supply will therefore be exhausted in 47 years. Estimating the probable duration of supply of forest products is not a matter of simple arithmetic. The rate of utilization is far from constant. It tends to increase with the discovery of new uses for wood, the increase in population and the increase in the demand for for-

est products from other countries whose supplies have been reduced to a greater extent than Canada's.

On the other hand there is a steady increase in volume taking place in all healthy stands of timber due to annual growth. By the application of scientific forest management this annual growth can be stimulated and could be made to take place over the entire area of potential forest land, it is believed.

In the value of forest products, logs and bolts headed the list of 1928 with over \$76,000,000. Pulpwood comes second with a total value exceeding \$74,000,000, and is the most valuable item of forest production in the provinces of Ontario and Quebec. Firewood with a total of over \$41,000,000, comes third for the Dominion as a whole, but heads the list in Manitoba, Saskatchewan, Nova Scotia and Prince Edward Island. Hewn railway ties with over \$5,000,000; poles with over \$4,000,000 and square timber with over \$3,000,000; are among the more important of the other items. The total estimated value of all these primary forest products is \$212,950,739, an increase of 3.9 per cent over the estimated value for 1927.

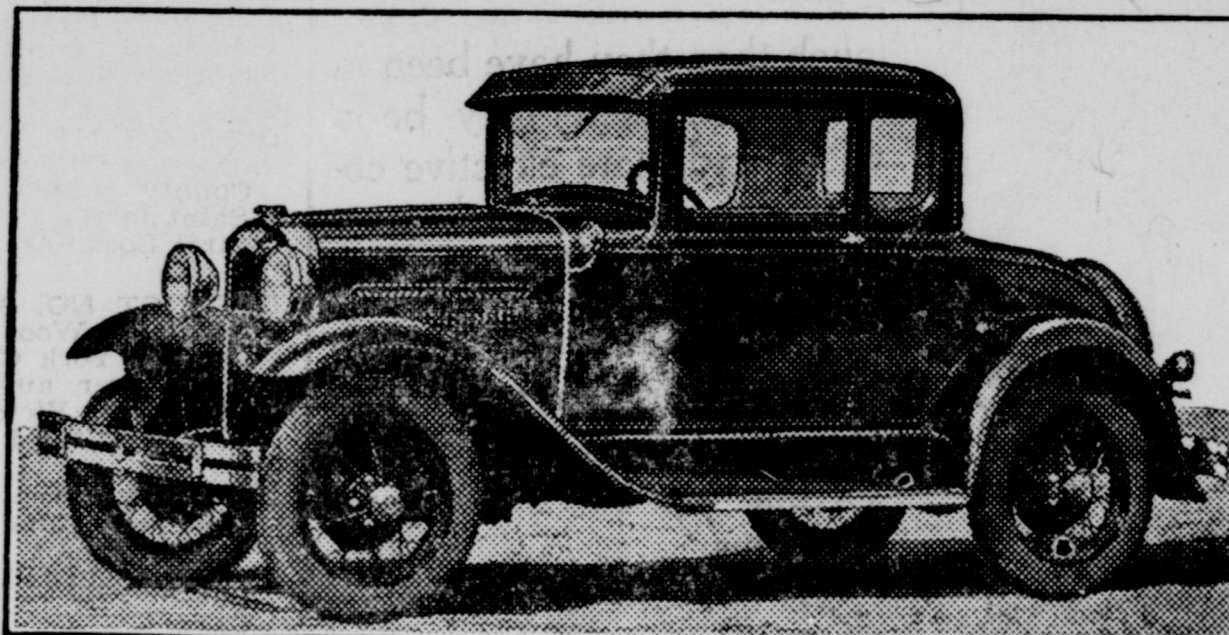
