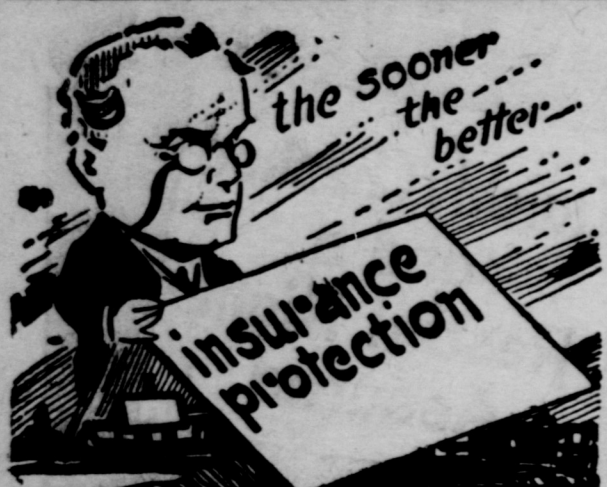

A VALUABLE SERVICE

The report of the Minister of Agriculture for Canada for the year ended March 31, 1932, contains an interesting summary of the work of the Publications Branch in the distribution of publications, market reports and related services. It shows that during the fiscal year under review a total of 9,918,737 items of published material were distributed, an increase of 2,127,986 over the preceding year. This included 2,228,433 bulletins, pamphlets and circulars; 2,018,383 copies of market reports; and nearly 2,000,000 copies of Seasonable Hints, official organ of the Dominion Experimental Farms Branch, the circulation of which has been suspended during the present fiscal year.
