

ANNUAL WOODSTOCK FALL EXHIBITION WILL OPEN ON TUESDAY

Big Fair To Last 3 Days And 3 Nights

CO., BIG SHOW

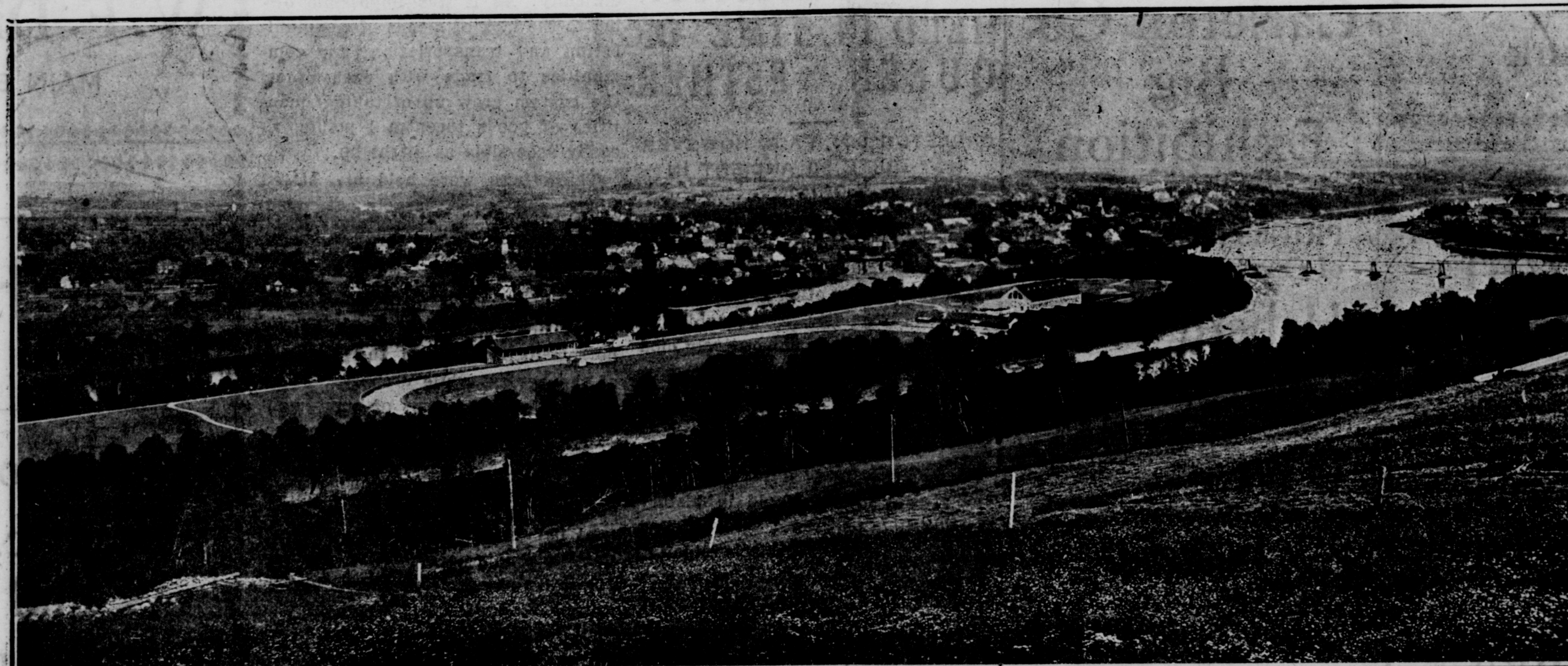
The Woodstock Exhibition will open on Tuesday next, Aug. 30 and will continue thereafter for three days and three nights, coming to a close on the evening of September 1. The decision to hold the fair this year was reached in spite of hard times and the scarcity of money. The officials in charge were convinced that the people of Carleton County wanted their exhibition as usual, and particularly the farmers. They therefore decided to carry on as usual with confidence that the people of the county will turn out in numbers as great as in more prosperous years, and give the big show their heartiest support.

Naturally, with money as tight as it is, some curtailment of expenses had to be made. The visible effects of the economy, however, will be less than would be expected in such times as the present, and very few old familiar features will be lacking.

There will be extensive industrial exhibits in the main building, an agricultural show which is expected to be better than ever, splendid livestock entries, a big midway, excellent vaudeville, band concerts and parades, and

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Woodstock's Beautiful Exhibition Grounds

The site for the big carnival could hardly have been more suited for the purpose if nature had constructed it to order for Agricultural Society No. 41, the sponsors of the exhibition. The fair grounds are located on this beautiful

island, containing in all about seventy acres, although all this space is not utilized by the exhibition authorities.

The island lies between Woodstock and Grafton, at the confluence of the Saint John and Meduxnekeag rivers. It is reached from the mainland by the highway bridge, from which an approach for automobile and foot traffic slopes down to the level of

the island. From the approach a beautiful avenue through a grove of shade trees leads to the fair grounds.

The visitor first sees the baseball diamond for which the island is famous as he emerges from the grove. At the far boundary of the ball field rises a commodious and imposing main building. To the south and east of the main building are the cattle sheds, while directly to the southward

are the dancing pavilion, dining hall and administrative offices. From the main building a long midway runs southward to the gates of the paddock of one of the finest half mile tracks on the continent, one of the few tracks in this part of the country which possesses a regulation home stretch. On the western side of the track is a capacious grandstand, opposite which is the judges stand and

a platform for vaudeville performances.

Among the island's many attractions is a miniature railway, complete with track, bridges, rolling stock, station and booking office. This is a feature which is always popular with the children and scarcely less so with the adults.

The island is circled by splendid roads and ample parking space is available.

Horse Races Will Be Of High Order

FREE FOR ALL WITH SEVERAL

One of the strong points of the Woodstock Exhibition has always been its splendid harness racing cards. This year an excellent meet is being arranged and it is expected that it will attract an unusually large number of race fans, as the opportunities to see cards of this class are going to be few and far between in this section this year.

The exhibition is fortunate in having one of the best race plants in Eastern Canada. Its half mile track is well adapted to speed and has a home stretch exceeding the regulation 65 feet in width, being one of the very few tracks similarly laid out in Eastern Canada.

Visiting horsemen like to come to Woodstock, as is shown by the large entry lists in the various classes each year. In connection with the track there are ample accommodations for the visiting horses, as well as those which make their quarters here during the season, and local and visiting drivers and owners are always sure of fair and courteous treatment.
