Temperature: 325°F.
Time: 12 to 15 minutes.
1 cup shortening; 1 cup brown sugar; 1/2 cup milk; 2 cups Ogilvie Minute Oats; 1/4 cup Royal Househould Flour; 3 teaspoons baking powder; 1 teaspoon salt.
Cream the shortening; add sugar, milk and Minute Oats. Add flour, which has been sifted with the baking powder and salt. Chill thoroughly, as this dough is very soft. Take out small quantity of dough and roll into a small ball between the palms of the hands. Place these balls on a greased cookie sheet about 2" apart with a fork, press flat, first one way and then the other. Bake as thin as possible. On top of each cookie place a small piece of red or green cherry. Bake in a slow oven 12 to 15 minutes. These cookies may be put together with the following date mixture:
1/4 lb. date; 1/4 cup sugar; 1 cup water; 1 teaspoon lemon juice.
Chop dates; add sugar, water and lemon juice. Cook until mixture is thick.
