PUBLIC MEETING IN TOWN HALL CONCERNING WESTERN RELIEF

At a public meeting held in the Town Hall on Tuesday evening representatives of the various churches of the town met to consider the appeal that has come from Western Canada for car loads of potatoes and other vegetables. The appeal has come to all the local churches and the necessity of it is urged by responsible bodies and officials in the higher courts of the various denominations.

In spite of government assistance the need of the people in sections of the West is greater than ever before. Large sections of Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta due to drought have been turned into a desert and the people are without food. Ways and means to help were considered. It was decided that on Sunday Oct. 25 a special voluntary offering be held in all the town churches for the purpose of sending a car load of potatoes to those in terrible need. Contributions from any who find it inconvenient to give on Sunday through the churches can be left with the Secy-Treas. of the local committee, Mr. F. L. Atherton.

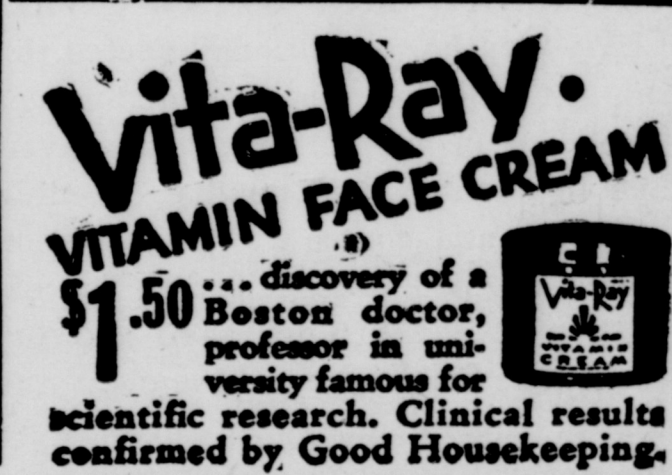
