The amount of infested rye varies from year to year with weather conditions. Labour costs have largely prevented Canadian ergot being collected and offered for sale. Experiments are being conducted to determine whether ergot may be economically produced under controlled conditions.

In addition to the work on these few drug plants, important for wartime uses, many others are being grown experimentally and particular emphasis is being placed on the search for strains or varieties with higher drug potencies.

The general public should be warned, urged Dr. Senn, that the growing and harvesting of drug is usually a difficult undertaking requiring great care and technical skill if the product is to be of any value. Although prices of some products may now be high the beginner cannot usually hope to receive large financial profits.

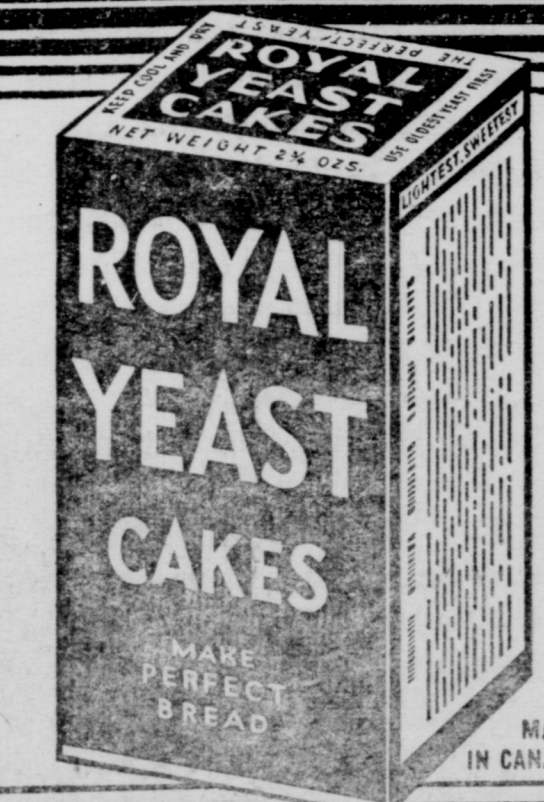

Miss Viola Brewer of Montreal is the guest of her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Traverse Brewer.

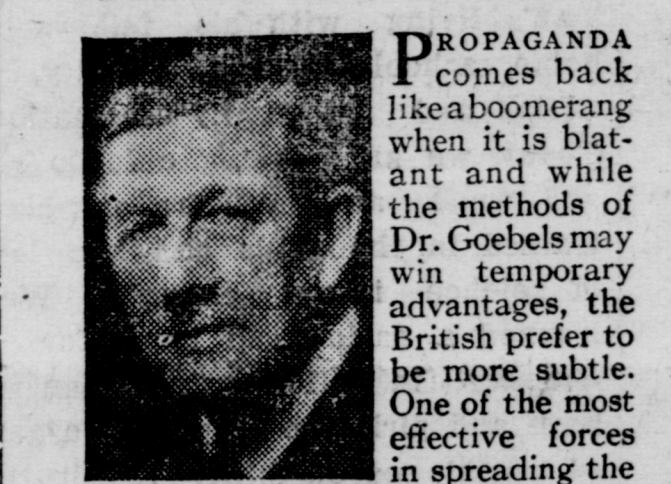

SIR MALCOLM ROBERTSON
BRITISH COUNCIL CHIEF

PROPAGANDA comes back like a boomerang when it is blatant and while the methods of Dr. Goebbels may win temporary advantages, the British prefer to be more subtle. One of the most effective forces in spreading the little advertised British Council which has organized the so-called British Institutes in countries such as Egypt, Turkey, Iraq, Palestine, Cyprus, Malta, Portugal and Colombia in South America. Classes in English have been given, films distributed, books and periodicals circulated, and even theatrical companies sent on tour. Sports directors have been supplied for instance W. J. Baget, who was appointed in 1938 Coach to the Galatariy Club in Istanbul. It has publications of its own such as "Great Britain and the East," a magazine which interprets Britain to the Oriental and incidentally promotes British trade. The Exhibit of British Art at the New York World's Fair which afterwards came to Ottawa, Toronto, Montreal and Vancouver was organized by the British Council. The late Lord Lloyd was a driving force in its early stages. Today the Chairman is Sir Malcolm Robertson, C.M.G., K.B.E., Conservative Member for Mitcham.

Sir Malcolm has had a long and distinguished diplomatic career. In 1927, when he was the first British Ambassador in Buenos Aires, he founded the Argentine Association of British Culture, thus anticipating one of the best-known and widespread forms of activity which was later to be developed by the British Council, a body created in 1934 for the purpose of making British life and thought better known abroad.

for real necessity of using as a worm destroyer. Phenothiazine does not replace the specific oil of chenopodium. It must not be used promiscuously and, in fact, should be used only when oil of chenopodium is not available and when it is fully established that harmful roundworm infections are present. If conditions of husbandry are such that heavy worm infections do occur, then such conditions must be adjusted (See Special Pamphlet No. 34 War-time Production Series on Prevention of Common Losses in Young Pigs), preferably under the supervision of a veterinarian. The doses recommended in the United States and tentatively adopted in Canada are: pigs from 25-50 lb. in weight, 9 grams; from 100-200 lb., 20 grams, and for pigs over 200 lb., 50 grams.

NOTICE

To Owners or Harbors of a Dog or Dogs in the County of Carleton.

You are required by law to purchase a Dog License and Tag for the year 1942 for your dog or dogs BEFORE JULY FIRST.

License and Tags can be secured from the Collector of Poor and County Rates in your parish or from the Secretary Treasurer's Office at the Court House, Woodstock.

Every owner or harbor of a dog or dogs who neglects to obtain a tag and keep it securely fixed on his dog or who uses a tag upon a dog other than that for which it was issued shall be liable on summary conviction to a penalty not exceeding Ten Dollars and costs of conviction and in addition to any penalty or penalties, in default of payment the convicting Magistrate may order such dog be destroyed.
