Official Report Of Carleton Co. Council

June 16th, 1942
TUESDAY, 11 A. M.

The County Council of the Municipality of Carleton met on Tuesday, June 16th, 1942, at 11 a. m. at the Court House, in the Town of Woodstock, in its regular Semi-Annual meeting pursuant to By-Law and Notice.

All Councillors were present except Councillor Hatfield.

Warden Sharpe presided. Council opened by singing the National Anthem, followed by prayer and a short address by the Rev. W. P. Stiles of the United Baptist Church, Jacksonville, N. B.

It was moved by Councillor Creighton, seconded by Councillor Rideout that a hearty vote of thanks be extended to Rev. Mr. Stiles for his address and encouraging remarks. Carried.

Moved by Councillor Kearney, seconded by Councillor Dibblee that the Council rise and stand with bowed heads in respect for two very important men who have passed on since we last gathered, that is E. W. Melville and Dr. N. P. Grant. Carried.

Warden Sharpe then addressed the Council, pointing out the large "Yes" Vote in Carleton County in the recent Plebiscite. He also mentioned the fact that Carleton County responded well to the Red Cross Drive and had gone over their quota.

The minutes of the January 1942 Session were read and on motion duly moved and seconded same were approved. Carried.

Regularly moved and seconded that we adjourn until 2 p. m. Carried.

TUESDAY, 2 P. M.

Council resumed pursuant to adjournment.

The Acting County Secretary-Treasurer gave a report of the Taxes collected to date making comparison with last year's figures, also a statement of the financial standing of the County as at June 13th, and it was moved by Councillor Creighton, seconded by Councillor Baker and Tracey that the report be accepted. Carried.

Moved by Councillor Tracey, seconded by Councillor Banks that the special Committee meet with the Secretary and bring in recommendations further amending the By-Laws in connection with Dog License. Carried.

On motion of Councillor Dibblee, seconded by Councillor Dibblee that this Council give permission that the old gun mounted on the Court House lawn be given for salvage. Carried.

Councillor Creighton reported for the Finance Committee and it was moved by Councillor Banks that the report be adopted. Carried.

Councillor Dibblee reported for the Building Committee and on motion duly moved, seconded and carried same was adopted.

Councillor Hubbard had nothing to

report regarding the By-Law Committee at the present time. Councillor Tracey had nothing to report regarding Hospital Committee at this time and Councillor Clark was asked to outline the Carleton County Hospital statement to the Council and on motion of Councillor Tracey, seconded by Councillor Dibblee that same be laid on the table for further discussion. Carried.

Councillor Thomas reported for the Board of Health, pointing out the fact that Dr. Wishart had resigned from the Board, also that the need of Slaughter Houses was very great and that something should be done about it and it was duly moved and seconded that the report be adopted. Carried.

Councillor Rideout reported progress for the Bills and Accounts Committee.

Councillor Lamont reported that the Sheep Claims Committee had not yet met.

Councillor Kearney had no report to make regarding Contingencies. Councillor Williams had no report to make regarding Vocational School. The special Committee appointed last January to inquire into the matter of interest rates at the Bank reported that our rate of interest appeared to be in line with what other Counties were paying.

At the January Session the Finance Committee were asked to bring in a report regarding the settlement of the Arrears Account with the Provincial Hospital and same was reported on by Councillor Creighton and Councillor Tracey.

Moved by Councillor Creighton, seconded by Councillor Tracey that the Secretary wire to ex-Warden Hatfield regarding what had been done about the Laura Currier matter and request Mr. Hatfield to authorize some one from Hartland to represent the Town of Hartland here tomorrow. Carried.

The Committee appointed to make recommendations regarding Government taking over the protection from fire of Granted Lands was heard. Councillor Lamont read a copy of a proposal from Victoria County with the Government, and it was moved by Councillor Creighton, seconded by Councillor Lamont, seconded by Councillor Lewis that the matter be left until the Committee meet Mr. Miller this evening. Carried.

On motion by Councillor Thomas seconded by Councillor Dibblee, Fire Warden Cheney was heard before the Council re fire fighting equipment.

Moved by Coun. Tracey, seconded by Coun. Clark that we find out if the Hospital what Parish the McLean child was admitted from. Carried.

Councillor Creighton brought a matter of no assessment being made in the Parish of Aberdeen and read a letter of opinion signed by the Solicitor, Mr. Squires and Mr. P. J. Hughes as to what action the County could take in regards to same.

Councillor Hannington and Councillor Lamont spoke, giving the reason for not assessing and also informed the Council that steps had been taken and an appeal was being made to the Government now.

Moved by Councillor Lamont, seconded by Councillor Hannington that a Committee from this Council be appointed to meet the Aberdeen Assessors and Mr. Walker tomorrow morning.

Moved an Amendment by Councillor Rideout, seconded by Councillor Foster, that the matter be left until Mr. Walker arrives tomorrow and that the Valuers be requested to be here as well.

Moved an amendment to the Amendment by Councillor Creighton, seconded by Councillor Lewis that this Council resolve itself into a Committee of the whole to-morrow morning at eleven o'clock and meet the Assessors of Aberdeen, the Valuator and Mr. Walker to discuss the Aberdeen Valuation. Carried.

Moved and seconded that we adjourn until tomorrow morning at 10 A. M. Carried.

June 17th, 1942
WEDNESDAY, 10 A. M.

Council resumed pursuant to adjournment.

The warden read a letter from the Carleton Sentinel regarding Army Week Advertisements. The cut of the ad was shown and it was moved by Councillor Dibblee, seconded by Councillor London that we take the space in the Carleton Sentinel at \$10 for one issue. Carried.

Moved by Councillor Creighton, seconded by Councillor Dibblee that the proposition as outlined in the letter of June 12th, from Mr. Walker be received and the Provincial Hospital bill settled as outlined therein. Carried.

It was moved by Councillor Creighton, seconded by Councillor Dibblee that the proposition as outlined in the letter of June 12th, from Mr. Walker be received and the Provincial Hospital bill settled as outlined therein. Carried.

Moved an Amendment by Councillor Tracey, seconded by Councillor Lewis that we tender the Provincial Hospital settlement for the amount of the Provincial Hospital bill less 20 per cent but with no interest charge of 1-2 of 1 per cent per month. Carried.

Moved by Councillor Tracey, seconded by Councillor Creighton that this Council resolve itself into a Committee of a whole to consider the Aberdeen Valuations. Carried.

Mr. Budd of Benton was heard before the Council regarding his assessment since he has lived in Carleton County, also other variations in the Assessments in his District.

It was moved by Councillor Bank, seconded by Councillor Thomas that the Taxes assessed by the Valuator in the Parish of Kent be struck off as he has paid taxes in the Parish of Peel. Carried.

The Valuers, Assessors of Aberdeen, the Council as a whole and Mr. Walker then went to conference re-Chairman of the Assessors of Aberdeen appeared with three delegates from Aberdeen and stated their grievance regarding the Valuation. The delegates were: C. A. Derran, William Scott and Arthur McIntosh.

Mr. Page, Chairman of the Valuation, making up of the Valuation for the County and also the review of Aberdeen's Valuation. Ex-Councillor Roy and Mr. Fred Mallory, the other two members of the Valuation Board, were also heard. Mr. Page gave the following rates per hundred of which the Valuation was made up:

WEDNESDAY, 2 P. M.

Council resumed pursuant to adjournment.

The Committee from the Town of Woodstock was heard regarding cigarettes for Soldiers Overseas and asked that the Council consider assisting in this work by contribution.

Moved by Councillor Creighton, seconded by Councillor Tracey that we revert to the regular order of business. Carried.

Moved by Councillor Creighton, seconded by Councillor Dibblee that this County vote \$50.00 toward the cigarette fund for Soldiers and that a Committee of one be appointed from the County, one from the Town and one from the Legion. Carried.

Mr. Scott was called on regarding the Children's Aid Society but first asked that Mr. Rex York explain the situation, after which Mr. Scott spoke, giving some instances where families needed more attention in the Province. Mr. Morgan, Rev. Mr. Profit and Rev. Mr. Leary, also others spoke on this matter.

A motion duly moved, seconded and carried the Council reverted to a Committee of the whole regarding the Valuation of Aberdeen. Mr. Walker pointed out that a Provincial Board appointed to re-value the County would cost a considerable amount of money and suggested that if possible a Committee of the Council be appointed or a Committee of the Chairmen of Assessors for each Parish be appointed to meet and come to some agreement. After Mr. Walker's suggestions the following Resolution was drawn up and on motion of Councillor Baker, seconded by Councillor Creighton same was adopted.

RESOLUTION
WHEREAS the Councillors of the Parish of Aberdeen are dissatisfied with the Valuation of the County taken during the year 1940, and are of the opinion that the Valuation placed on the said Parish is inequitable as compared with the Valuations placed on the other Parishes within the County; and

WHEREAS the Councillors of the Parish of Aberdeen, on behalf of the said Parish, have agreed to the appointment of a Committee to investigate their claim and have agreed to be bound by the findings of the said Committee; and

WHEREAS the Council of the Municipality of Carleton has agreed to become bound by the findings of the said Committee; and

WHEREAS the said Councillors of the Parish of Aberdeen have agreed to have the Parish Warrants for the years 1941 and 1942 levied in full during the year 1942.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that a Committee be appointed composed of the Warden, as Chairman, and the Chairmen of the Boards of Assessors of each of the Parishes and Towns within the County to investigate and study the said Valuation of the Parish of Aberdeen as compared with the Valuations of the other Parishes within the County.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a bill be presented at the next session of the Legislature to ratify all actions taken under this Resolution. Carried.

Adjutant Harris of the Salvation Army, Woodstock, N. B. was heard regarding raising money for the Home Fund.

Moved by Councillor Rideout, seconded by Councillor Kearney that the Acting Secretary-Treasurer be and is hereby authorized to pay the Bills and Accounts as passed by the Council sitting as a Committee of the whole. Carried.

At this time Warden Sharpe resumed his seat as Warden.

Recommendation of the Fire Prevention Committee

We, your Fire Prevention Committee, appointed at the January session have met with Mr. G. L. Miller, Chief Forester, last evening and after due consideration we recommend to this Council the following:

1. That Carleton County carry on as in the past but purchase a supply of 22 Hand Pumps and Tanks at an approximate cost of \$12.00 each, 2 for each Parish throughout the County and be accounted for and looked after by the Councillors of each Parish.

2. That the Secretary-Treasurer take a property receipt from the Councillors in each Parish and the equipment remains the property of the Municipality of Carleton. These are to be charged to Contingencies Account.

RECOMMENDATION
We, the Committee, appointed to amend By-Laws regarding the Protection of Sheep from Dogs recommend:

1. That in case of a dog destroying or losing License Tag that the owner be given a new Tag and be charged 25c for same and the owner to make affidavit before a Justice of the Peace that former Tag had been destroyed or lost.

2. That after July 1st, action will be taken against owners of Dogs who have not procured licenses and the Collector of Poor and County Rates furnish a list of dog owners who have not obtained a license.
