A Washington dispatch says that United States Senator Hill has been tendered the portfelio of secretary of state by Presidentelect Cleveland in person.

The Canadian government has invited the In perial Government to send a commission to Canada to inquire into the sanitary conditions of Canadian cattle at Canada's expense. It is expected the result will be the removal of the embargo on Canadian cattle.

The New York Herald says a syndicate of American capitalists have acquired virtual control of the island of San Domingo by the purchase of the right to collect customs revenue of the country. The price is said to be \$3,500,000, and Postmaster General Wanamaker and Senator Quay are said to be members.

Sir Adams G. Archibald is dead, in his 78th year. He was one of the fathers of the Canadian confederacy. Sir Adams was one of the leaders of the liberal party previous to 1867, but at that time joined those conservative leaders who were in favor of confederation. He was the first governor of the Northwest, going out to Fort Garry in the troublous times after the first rebellion. He occupied government house there from 1870 to 1873. Sir Adams was governor of Nova Scotia from 1873 to 1883, and after that time sat for Colchester in the Dominion parliament.

George McInnis, twelve years of age, son of Mr. George McInnis of Marysville, N. B. lost his life by drowning at Marysville last week. Mr. McInnis is working in the woods for Mr Gibson. His home is on the east side of the Nashwaak river, near the mill dam. It is necessary, therefore, to cross the river to get to the public school. George, the son, thought that instead of going by way of the bridge, as was his custom, he would skate across to school after dinner yesterday just above the mill dam. The ice seemed firm and all right. When nearing the slip of the new shingle mill, however, the ice yielded to his weight, and the poor bey sank only to be taken out a corpse. Before assistance could reach him life was extinct. As soon as the body was recovered every effort was made to restore animation. Deceased was a promising young boy and a general favorite in the town. His step mother is almost distracted over the sad event. The sad news will be sent to the father as quickly as possible.

His Holiness the Pope has cancelied three festivals of the Roman Cathelic Church, because too many holidays put the people of this province behind those of neighboring countries in the industrial race. These three days are, however, still statutory helidays. The Dominion laws define the expression "holiday" in the Interpretation Act to mean the "Annunciation. \* \* \* Corpus Christi, St. Peter and St Paul's day." This is, we presume one of the matters in which, as it was once put in the margin of a provincial statute, "the decrees of our Holy Father the Pope are binding," not that the Pope's decree can have legal effect, without current legislation, but that must follow. So far as the Federal law is concerned, we presume Sir John Thompson will immediately cause a law to be passed to ratify the ammendment to the Canadian law made by the Pope. The Province must do the same. Otherwise the law of the land will be maintaining ecclesiastical holidays after the Pope himself has abolsihed them .- Witness
