THE RESULT. The election is over and Messrs. Phinney and Gogain will represent the county of Kent in the new legislature. The government majority of nearly 800 a year ago has been changed to a minority of 300.

Messrs. Phinney and Gogain were thereupon declared duly elected. Mr. Phinney then addressed the electors, thanking them for their hearty support, and declaring that he would use his best efforts to further the interests of the county of Kent.

Mr. Blair in an interview reported in the St. John Telegraph, denies that he wrote to Father Pelletier, of St. Louis, a letter touching on the religious questions affecting schools in this province. We are reliably informed that Father Pelletier stated to his congregation from the pulpit on the Sunday before the election, that he had received such a letter from the attorney-general.

Mr. Legere said he stood before them as a defeated candidate. He said he had done a great deal for the county, and he thought the people were ungrateful. He had confidently believed that he would be elected. He had received a majority of nearly 800 only a year ago, and he could not see why the people should change their verdict.

Throughout the province the result has hardly been satisfactory to either party. The government has apparently secured a majority of the assembly, but nearly all the best men of the party have been defeated. The greatest surprise was the defeat of the attorney-general in York.

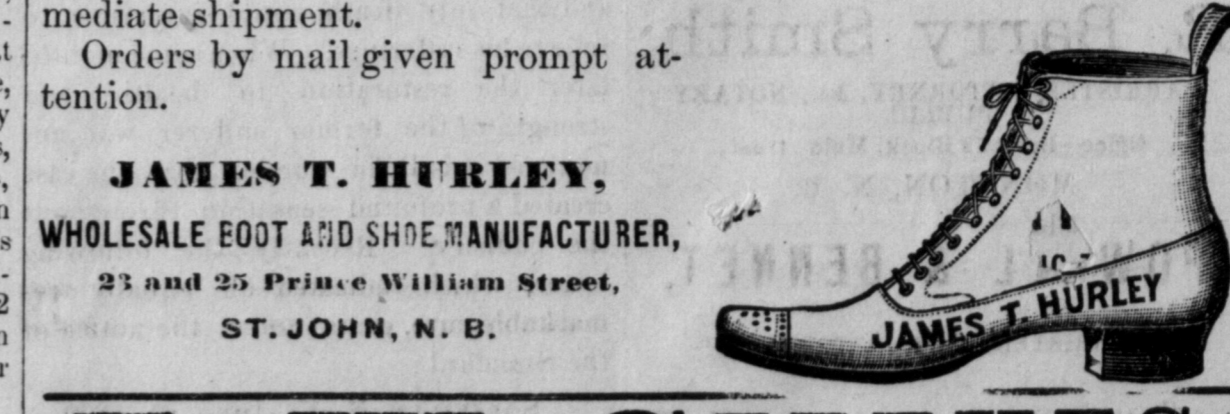

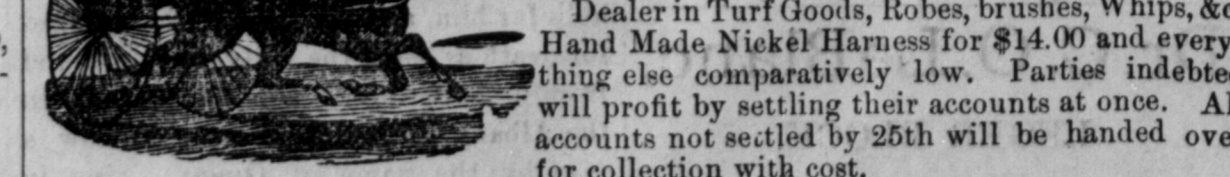
