Kent County S. S. Convention.

Perhaps there are few in Kent County who do not know something of Bass River. This thriving village was visited by a large number from various portions of the county last week under most favorable circumstances last week, for it was here that the Kent County Sabbath School Convention met on the 20th and 21st of September.

The delightful scenery and charming weather were all that could be desired, while all combined to recall the lines:

"The never failing brook, the busy mill, The decent church that top'd the neighboring hill,"

and all agree in saying,

"Loveliest village of the plain."

At 9 o'clock the large Presbyterian church was quite well filled with earnest S. S. workers, and soon after this the convention was called to order by the president, Rev. W. McLeod.

After a half hour of spirited devotional exercises, the work, of a routine character, was taken up, chief of which was the election of officers for the ensuing year. The officers of the association are as follows: President, Rev. Mr. Cameron; Secretary, Mr. Edwin Bowser; Vice-Presidents, Rev. W. McLeod and Rev. F. A. Wightman; Executive Committee, Mr. H. A. West, Rev. Wm. Hamilton, A. Dunn, Stephen R. Cameron.

The parish vice-presidents are as follows: Carleton, S. R. Cameron; Richibucto, north, Robt. W. Beers; Richibucto, south, Robt. Main; Wellington, Dr. King, Dundas and St. Marys, H. A. West; South East Weldford, Alexander Mundle; North Weldford, William Marshall; East Weldford, Miss Nina Black; Harcourt, J. E. G. Atkinson. At the various sessions important subjects were discussed, being on S. S. work, and no doubt those present took away much valuable information regarding this important branch of church work.

The field secretary, Rev. Mr. Lucas, lent valuable service, particular mention may be made of the black board exercises. Mr. Lucas' work seems to be bearing fruit in this county, as the report shows an increase of seven schools.

It is the aim of this association to tabulate as many scholars in the S. Schools as there are in the day schools in the same communities, and to encourage the keeping open all the year. All reports show gratifying progress.
