





Amount of Unclaimed Funds in Eng. land.

LONDON, Sept. 27 .- Attention has lately been attracted to the subject of the unclaimed funds which have been accumulating in the national exchequer for the past two or three centuries by the fact, recently developed, that the new Royal Courts of Justice have been built mainly with the surplus interest on the funds. In 1891 the funds in Chancery amounted to nearly \$350,000,000, and some years since Mr. Gladstone found it convenient to borrow \$200,000,000 of the suitors' money as a national loan.




