The United States census returns from 1890 show that the number of Canadians in the United States in that year was 980,-941 as compared with 717,157 in 1880, an increase of 263,784, or about 37 per cent. The number of Canadians in the New England states in 1890 was 380,167, as against 175,426 in 1880, showing that in ten years the number has considerably more than doubled. The division of the population of Canadians in the New England States is : English, 174,406 ; French, 205,761. In Massachusetts the increase is very marked. The number of Canadians residing there in 1890 being 207,601, as against 74,203 in 1880.
