GENERAL NEWS.

A train carrying 250 emigrants passed through Moncton Saturday night for the west.

It has been decided that the Dominion parliament shall meet for the despatch of business on the 19th of January.

At a meeting of the cabinet an order-in-council was passed naming Judge Strong as Chief Justice of the Supreme Court. It is said that the Puisse Judgeship has been offered to Judge King of New Brunswick.

The will of the late Jay Gould has been offered for probate. The executors say in their petition that the property in this state consists of two million dollars in realty and seventy millions of dollars personally.

T. W. Russell, M. P., who played a prominent part in the Irish discussion of the last parliament, was to leave for Canada by the majestic on November 30th, "to investigate the relations between the dominion and provincial parliaments of Canada, and, generally, the question of Canadian politics" so far as they afford any parallel or illustration of what will happen if an Irish parliament were established. Mr. Russell will travel direct from New York to Toronto, and spend some time in Ontario and Quebec.

A communication has been received at the department of justice stating that the prisoner "Jim," now in Dorchester penitentiary, has admitted that his confession that he shot Constable Steadman was a lie. He says he made the confession with the object of saving "Buck's" neck, but he admits that the evidence was too conclusive against Olsen.

The United States census returns from 1890 show that the number of Canadians in the United States in that year was 980,941 as compared with 717,157 in 1880, an increase of 263,784, or about 37 per cent. The number of Canadians in the New England states in 1890 was 380,167, as against 175,426 in 1880, showing that in ten years the number has considerably more than doubled. The division of the population of Canadians in the New England States is: English, 174,406; French, 205,761. In Massachusetts the increase is very marked. The number of Canadians residing there in 1890 being 207,601, as against 74,203 in 1880.

The doors of the Law School of Ontario have been opened to women and they may now enter upon the study of law in accordance with the act of the last session of the Legislature, which empowers the benchers to allow women to enter upon the study of and to qualify themselves for the profession of solicitor. At a meeting of convocation Attorney General Mowatt was present and cast his vote in favor of the ladies.

The members of the Royal Commission on the liquor question, who have been pursuing their inquiries on the Pacific coast, have left California, making their way east through the United States. Rev. Dr. McLeod is expected to reach Fredericton before Christmas.

Alderman John Hartley, Republican, of Patterson, N.J., convicted of taking a bribe of \$200 in securing the appointment of Policeman Cox, was sentenced to one year in prison and pay the cost of the proceedings. Policeman Cox was convicted of conspiring to bribe Hartley and sentenced to one year in prison and pay costs. Both were admitted to bail in \$5,000 pending the proceedings on a writ of error.

In a few minutes a large crowd had assembled and found that the fire had started between the ceiling and second floor, through a defective pipe hole. It was soon extinguished, however, and thus our town was saved from the fate of Buctouche.


