A Judge's Charge With Variations.

The following comes from Kansas, and its accuracy is vouched for by the stenographer who took it down:

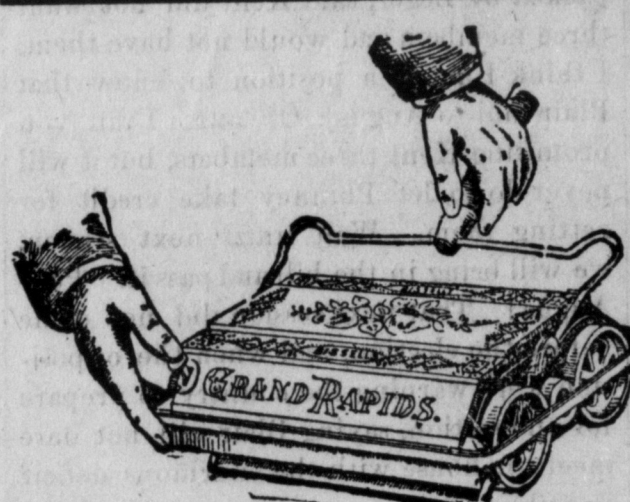

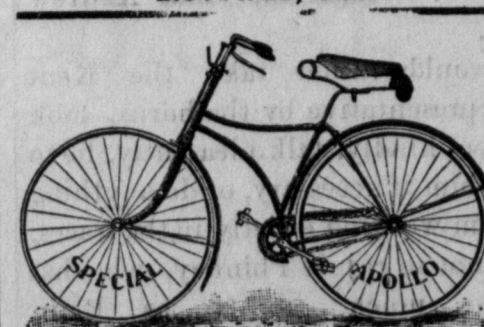
