

Canon Brigstock preached the sermon. A large number of the Episcopal clergymen of the Maritime provinces were present on the occasion.

The Empire's Halifax correspondent says that at the conference between members of the Canadian and Newfoundland governments, which came to an end in that city Tuesday night, the question of confederation was considered, and a basis of terms of union agreed upon. The Newfoundland delegates will submit it to their government, and if accepted by it the question will be submitted to a plebiscite of the people. The Newfoundlanders want a per capita allowance equal to their proportion of the Dominion debt which would be equal to \$9,000,000 and they want the Dominion to undertake the completetion of the railway across the island to Hales bay, a distance of 300 miles. The trial of G. L. Kelley, of Andover, for assault on a companion named Walter

Scott on election day, took place at Andover on Thursday before Judge Stevens. Kelley and Scott, it will be remembered, had a fight. A few days later Scott died, and then it was remembered that Kelly had struck him several times with a hammer and pushed him through a window, scratching his wrist. An examination was held and death found to have resulted from blood-poisoning. Kelley was arrested and tried for assault with intent to do grievous bodily harm. After hearing all the evidence, the jury returned a verdict of malicicious assault without intent to do grievous harm, and Judge Stevens sentenced the prisoner to jail for one year.
