The Local Government Tax.

A meeting of the agents of the local fire insurance companies was to have been held yesterday, to consider what action should be taken in respect to the new tax imposed upon them by the local government, but had to be postponed until Monday next because of the absence of several members.

The committee to whom was entrusted the preparation of a scheme to overcome the difficulty has presented a report. They regret that the enactment will compel the companies to advance rates, and they recommend that hereafter reductions should cease as far as possible, and that rates on revisions be advanced sufficiently to protect even the smallest business. They also advise that re-ratings be proceeded with and extended from the county of Westmorland to other counties without delay the increase being adopted to circumstances of each locality and introduced with judgment. This report is likely to meet with general approval, though it is understood that one or two members favor a system of direct taxation of five cents for the country and 2½ cents on all city business. This, it is said, would about make up the amount of the tax. The tax provides for one per cent. on net premiums and an additional sum of \$100 from all companies whose head office is not in the province.

The Royal Arcanum has appointed a committee to confer with other similar mutual benefit societies with a view to protesting against the application of the new tax to them. It is likely such other societies as receive tax bills will join with them.—Telegraph.

A Sublime Sentinel.

A new invention called the submarine sentinel is attracting much attention in nautical circles in England, and is honored with a column and a half description in the London Times. It is an inexpensive device, simple in construction and to look at, but it seems to contain a potency for good which it would be difficult to exaggerate. A written description would be difficult to understand, but the instrument consists of two pieces of three-quarter-inch board screwed together at right angles and sharpened at one end. To the sharpened end a catch and bar are attached. When this contrivance is suspended at a certain angle from a wire attached to a ship in motion it immediately takes a header toward the bottom and follows the course of the ship at any desired distance below the keel according to the length of the wire given to it. Supposing, for instance, that it is set at twenty fathoms, it goes quietly along until the twenty-fathom limit is reached. The sharp end always travels first, and as the bar attached to it touches the bottom a spring is released which detaches the sentry and permits it to rise to the surface, while at the same instant a warning bell is rung automatically on deck. The invention has been tried under various conditions and has always worked to perfection, and it is claimed that no ship provided with this apparatus could get into shoal water without the officer on deck being instantly aware of it. The importance of this, if true, is something that can be readily appreciated by the veriest landsman.
