Richibucto Division, No. 42, S. of T., meets Wednesday evening in the Temperance hall.

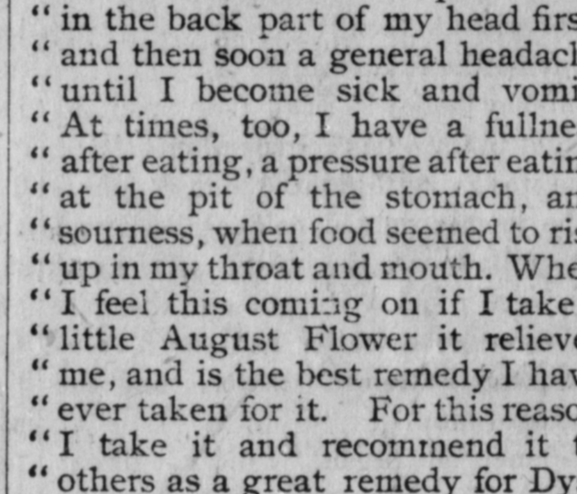
