BLOWING UP IN POLITICAL STRIFE.

THE NEW SCANDAL COMMISSION.

The new scandal commission determined on by the Quebec government was to be issued on Tuesday last. Its hands will apparently be full from the outset. A

full budget of scandals was outlined in a stamp speech late last week by the Quebec Minister of Works. They had occurred in his own department. Orders had been given for work and materials without tender or contract to the extent of nearly half a million dollars.

Chile and the U. S.

NEW YORK, Jan. 5.—The Herald's correspondent at Valparaiso telegraphs: "I hear that Chilean Government has cabled orders to Minister Montt at Washington to make a sincere apology to the United States for the attack upon Baltimore sailors on Oct. 16. The apology is said to be unqualified in character. Other matters which have been in dispute between Chile and the United States will be speedily considered by the new administration."
