

Jack The Ripper.

One of the earliest theories in relation to the series of ghastly murders in Whitechapel, was that the assassin was not a native of London, but a man employed on a trading steamer, possibly in the capacity of butcher. This theory seemed to agree with the periodicity of the crimes and the disappearance of the perpetrator. In support of this idea, the St. James' Gazette publishes some alleged facts, imparted, it says by a person in a responsible position. The informant declares that the undisputed "Ripper" murders occurred invariably (except in one instance), just after the arrival of two cattle steamers trading between London and Oporto, on each occasion one, at least, of four Portuguese cattlemen, whom he names, was on board one of the steamers alluded to. As soon as he had ascertained these facts, he informed the police, who set a close watch upon the boats, whereupon, the murders ceased. On the only occasion when a murder was committed, without either of 2 00 the two vessels referred to, being in the docks, [another cattle-ship from Oporto 4 10 had just arrived, and one of the four suspected was on board her. All these four men are now engaged as boatmen or bath-6 66 ing-men at Oporto, and could be arrested, if necessary at a moment's notice. It is worthy of note that Mr. Montague Williams, in his reminiscences, refers to the fact that the murders ceased after the police had acted upon a theory suggested to him by a private citzen, and there is reason to believe that this Oporto cattle-boat theory is the one which Mr. Williams had in his mind .- N. Y. Evening Post.
